NO. 162 Introduced by Senators Pimentel, Jr. and Shahani, and the Conmittee on Local Government, per Committee Report No. 114 AN ACT ORGANIZING THE REGIONAL CONSULTATIVE COMMISSION, DESCRIBING ITS POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled: SECTION 1. Title of the Act. - This Act shall be known as the Regional Consultative Commission Act of 1988. 2. Purpose of the Commission. - It SEC. is the purpose of the Regional Consultative Conmission to in the enactment by Congress of the Organic Act assist for the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao. SEC. 3. Composition of the Commission. - To carry out the above purpose, and considering ethno-linguistic, geographical, sectoral, educational and cultural factors, there 18 hereby created the Regional Consultative Connission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission." shall be composed of not more than fifty-five (55) which members, twenty-seven (27) of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Philippines from a list of nominees proposed by the different nultisectoral bodies coming from the provinces of Basilan, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi, Zamboanga del Sur, Zamboanga del Norte, North Cotabato, Maguindanao, Sultan Kudarat, Lanao del Norte, Lanao del Sur, Davao del Sur, South Cotabato, and Palawan, as well as the chartered city of Janboanga and the component cities

therein: <u>Provided</u>, That each of the twenty-seven

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legislative districts in the abovementioned provinces and 1 city shall have one (1) representative: Provided, further, 2 That the enumeration of the aforementioned provinces and 3 city shall not mean that all or any of them constitute 4 Muslim Mindanao as the term appears in Sections 15 and 5 of Article X of Constitution: Provided, 6 19 the 7 That the President may, at her own furthermore, discretion, appoint not more than twenty-eight (28) other 8 8 sectoral representatives to the Connission from the proposed area of autonomy: Provided, finally, That all 10 nominees to the Regional Consultative Commission shall 11 subject to confirmation by the Commission 12 on be 13 Appointments.

SEC. 4. <u>Qualifications</u>. A No person shall be 14 nember of the Commission unless he is a 15 appointed of the Philippines, at natural-born citizen least 16 of age at the time of his eighteen (18) years 17 appointment, a resident of the region for at least 18 five (5) years innediately preceding the appointment, a 19 qualified voter or one who would gualify as such, and 20 probity, integrity, independence 21 of recognized and 22 nationalism.

23 SEC. 5. <u>Disqualifications</u>.- The following are dis-24 qualified from being members of the Commission:

a) Persons who are not qualified for appointment to a government office under Sections 6 and 7, Heading B, of Article IX of the Constitution, and other existing laws;

29 b) Persons convicted of a crime involving
30 moral turpitude.

31 SEC. 6. <u>Oath or Affirmation</u>. - Members of the Com-32 mission shall qualify and assume office by taking the

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1 following oath or affirmation:

2 "I (name), having been appointed to the 3 position of Member of the Regional Consultative 4 Commission, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will well and faithfully discharge to the best of 5 my ability the duties of my present position to 8 7 assist Congress in the enactment of an organic act for Muslim Mindanao that is truly reflective of 8 8 the ideals and aspirations of the people of Muslim Mindanao, that I will support and defend the 10 11 Constitution of the Philippines; that I will obey the laws and legal orders promulgated by the duly 12 13 constituted authorities and maintain true faith allegiance to the Republic of 14 and the 15 Philippines; and that I impose this obligation 16 upon myself voluntarily, without mental 17 reservation or purpose of evasion."

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18 SEC. 7. Organization. - (a) The President shall 19 designate the person or persons in charge of all arrange-20 ments for the convening of the Regional Consultative Com-21 mission.

(b) The Commission shall be convened by authority of the President on the second Monday of March 1988, in the City of Zamboanga at 10:00 o'clock in the morning, or on such other date, or in such other place as may be fixed by the President.

(c) The person designated by the President shall
preside at its opening session until a presiding officer is
elected by the Commission. The Commission shall be deemed
organized upon the election and qualification of a Chairman
and presiding officer.

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(d) A majority of all its members shall

constitute a quorum to do business, but a smaller number
 may meet, adjourn from day to day, and compel the
 attendance of absent members in such manner and under such
 penalties as the Commission may provide.

5 (e) The Commission may determine the rules of its 6 proceedings, punish its members for disorderly behavior, 7 and, with the concurrence of two-thirds of all its members, 8 expel a member.

9 (f) While not attending sessions, the Commis10 sioners shall hold office in their respective districts.
11 The Commission Secretariat shall be based in the City of

The Commission Secretariat shall be based in the City of
Zamboanga, or in such other place as may be fixed by the
Commission.

14 (g) The plenary sessions of the Commission shall 15 be public and duly recorded. It shall hold its sessions in 16 the City of Zamboanga, or in such other place as may be 17 fixed by the Commission, provided that the Commission or 18 any of its committees may also hold sessions in the City of 19 Cotabato or in such other place in the Philippines that 20 the Commission or any of its committees may determine.

21 Consultations with committees of either House of 22 Congress shall be held at their respective seats in Metro-23 politan Manila.

24 The buildings of the Sangguniang Panpook (h) 25 and their premises in the cities of Zamboanga and Cotabato 26 are hereby made available for the use of the 27 Commission. All civilian government entities, agencies and 28 instrumentalities in the proposed area of autonomy shall 29 place at the disposal of the Conmission without cost, 30 refund additional or pay such of their personnel, 31 premises and furniture as can, in their judgment, be 32 spared without detriment to public service.

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1 SEC. 8. Filling of Vacancies. - Whenever a vacancy 2 occurs in the Commission, the President may, upon due certification by the Chairnan of the Commission, 3 fill 4 the vacancy by appointment, with the consent of the Connission on Appointments, after 5 consultation with 6 the group or sector represented by the member whose seat 7 has become vacant.

8 SEC. 9. <u>Parliamentary Immunities</u>. - (a) A member 9 of the Commission shall, in all offenses punishable by not 10 more than six (6) years imprisonment, be privileged from 11 arrest while the Commission is in session.

(b) A member of the Commission shall not be questioned nor held liable in any other place for any speech or debate in the Commission, in any committee thereof, or in any public hearing conducted by the Commission or any committee thereof whenever held.

17 (c) The penalties imposed in Articles 143, 144 145 of the Revised Penal Code, as amended, for 18 and defined therein shall apply to any person 18 offenses connitting an offense against the Commission or 20 its 21 connittees or subconnittees, or the members thereof.

22 SEC. 10. Responsibilities and Functions of the 23 Conmission. - Pursuant to the mandate of the Constitution, 24 Congress shall enact an organic act for the autonomous 25 region in Muslim Mindanao with the assistance of the 26 Regional Consultative Commission, and for this purpose: 27 (a) The Commission shall conduct public

28 consultations and hearings at the district level and on 29 regional basis, where the views and recommendations of 30 various sectors, both governmental and non-governmental, 31 shall be taken and recorded.

32 (b) The Commission may organize any number of

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conmittees it may deem necessary for the purpose.

2 (c) The record of the deliberations during the 3 public hearings, including draft resolutions submitted, 4 shall be open to public inspection under such guidelines as 5 the Commission may deem reasonable and necessary.

(d) Within one hundred fifty (150) days from its 6 Conmission shall submit to Congress for its 7 convening the consideration, periodic reports aside information and 8 9 from its final report relative to the proposed organic That after such period, act: Provided, however, Congress 10 may start deliberations on said proposed organic act 11 provisions the Regional based on whatever sections or 12 Consultative Commission has already submitted. The final 13 draft of the report of the Commission shall be approved 14 by a majority of all the members of the Commission. 15

Congressional Liaison. - In order to 16 SEC. 11. ensure coordination between Congress and the Commission, 17 there is hereby created a special ad hoc connittee composed 18 of five (5) members each from the Senate and the House of 19 Representatives to be designated by the President of the 20 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, 21 respectively. The ad hoc connittee shall be co-chaired by 22 the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Local Government 23 and the Chairman of the House Committee on Local 24 It shall be the purpose and function of the Government. 25 connittee to oversee the work of the Connission. 26

27 SEC. 12. <u>Drafting and Enactment of the Organic</u> 28 <u>Act.</u> - Congress shall draft and enact an organic act, 29 taking into account the report and recommendations 30 submitted by the Commission. Nothing provided in this Act,

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however, shall be interpreted to restrict or impair the
 power of Congress to accept, modify or reject any part or
 all the report and recommendations of the Commission.

4 SEC. 13. <u>Tenure</u>. - The Commission shall cease to 5 exist sixty (60) days after the submission of its final 6 report as provided in Section 10 hereof.

7 SEC. 14. <u>Staffing</u>.- The Commission shall be 8 responsible for maintaining its own Secretariat as well 9 as such other staff as it may deem necessary. Except those 10 detailed from other government offices, the tenure of 11 office of the regular staff of the Secretariat shall be 12 coterminous with the tenure of the Commission.

Each Commissioner shall also be entitled to a personal staff of four (4) composed of an executive assistant, a secretary and two technical assistants: <u>Frovided</u>, <u>however</u>, That the tenure of office of the regular personal staff of each Commissioner shall be coterminous with his own tenure of office.

19 15. <u>Coupensation</u>. - Each member shall SEC. be 20 entitled to a per dien of five hundred pesos (P500.00) for each day of attendance in the Commission or any of its 21 22 committees, or during district consultations, and a cost of 23 living allowance of five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per 24 month, and actual travolling expenses not exceeding five 25 thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per month.

SEC. 16. <u>Funding</u>. - The sum of twenty million pesos (P 20,000,000) is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to carry out the purposes for which this Commission is established.

31 SEC. 17. <u>Separability Clause.</u> - If any part or
 32 provision of this Act is declared invalid or

unconstitutional, the other parts or provisions thereof
 shall remain valid and effective.
 SEC. 18. <u>Effectivity</u>. - This Act shall take effect

4 upon its publication in at least two newspapers of general 5 circulation.

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
