## RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEES ON AGRARIAN REFORM AND SOCIAL JUSTICE, WELFARE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE BRUTAL AND BRAZEN KILLING OF NINE SUGAR WORKERS IN SAGAY CITY, NEGROS OCCIDENTAL

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2018 at about 9:30 p.m., nine sugar workers, among them three women and two teenagers, belonging to the National Federation of Sugar Workers (NFSW) were reportedly shot and burned while they were resting in their makeshift shelter;

WHEREAS, the brutal and brazen killing was committed inside Hacienda Nene in Sagay City, Negros Occidental, an area the sugar farmers had allegedly occupied as part of an agrarian reform assertion campaign called Bungkalan;

WHEREAS, the Constitution, in Article XIII, Section 4 mandates the State to "undertake an agrarian reform program founded on the right of the farmers and regular farmworkers, who are landless, to own directly or collectively the lands they till or, in the case of other farmworkers, to receive a just share of the fruits thereof xxx";

WHEREAS, Congress enacted Republic Act No. 6657 or the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Law in 1988 to give life to this Constitutional mandate of distributing lands to landless farmers. This was amended in 2009 to institute some reforms and to extend the period of distribution of lands;

21 22 **WHEREAS**, in a news report, NFSW claims that land distribution to farmers has been very slow paced with implementation only at about forty percent  $(40\%)^1$ ;

WHEREAS, while authorities are investigating the incident to hold to account the perpetrators, Congress must inquire into the root cause of the continuous quest of our farm workers for reform in the agrarian sector to address their real needs through effective legislation and also to prevent further violence and loss of lives; and

WHEREAS, Congress must give the highest priority to the enactment of appropriate measures to achieve social justice, reduce economic iniquities, and to equitably diffuse wealth for the benefit of our farmers, having due regard to the rights of landowners;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the Senate Committees on Agrarian Reform and Social Justice, Welfare and Rural Development to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the brutal and brazen killing of nine sugar workers in Sagay City, Negros Occidental.
