DIRECTING THE COMMITTEE ON TRADE AND COMMERCE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON FILIPINO SEAMEN REPORTEDLY FAILING TO MEET INTERNATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Constitution, Article 2, Section 18 states that, "The State affirms labor as a primary social economic force. It shall protect the rights of workers and promote their welfare";

WHEREAS, is has been a growing and well-known concern that Filipino seamen lose up to 180,000 job openings because they are allegedly having problems meeting world seafaring standards:

WHEREAS, officers of the PMIAA cited that the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) "jeopardizes the employment" of the country's seamen because of training requirements not mandated by Republic Act No. 8544, also known as the Philippine Merchant Marine Officers Act of 1998;

WHEREAS, the PMIAA also points out the PRC's manual written licensure examination greatly discourages potential officers;

WHEREAS, the PMIAA stressed that Filipino seamen should meet the international standards in order to maintain the country's edge in world shipping;

WHEREAS, PMIAA's concerns necessitates the review of and, if necessary, amendments on R.A. No. 8544 in order to improve the competitiveness of the country's ship officers and shipping industry;

WHEREFORE, be it hereby resolved by the Philippine Senate, to direct the proper Senate Committee to conduct an inquiry in aid of legislation, on Filipino seamen reportedly failing to meet international qualifications.
