RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING THE WOMEN  
AND MEN WHO PARTICIPATED AND WON IN  
THE 24TH SOUTHEAST ASIAN GAMES HELD  
IN NAKHON RATCHASIMA, THAILAND, LED  
BY MOST VALUABLE PLAYER MIGUEL  
MOLINA

WHEREAS, the 24<sup>th</sup> Southeast Asian Games (SEA Games) in Nakhon Ratchasima, Thailand concluded with the Philippines placing sixth (6<sup>th</sup>) in the eleven-nation regional sports competition:
