- AN ACT EXPANDING THE PROMOTION OF BREASTFEEDING, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7600, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO ALL GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE HEALTH INSTITUTIONS WITH ROOMING-IN AND BREASTFEEDING PRACTICES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Expanded
2	Breastfeeding Promotion Act of 2009".
3	SEC. 2. Section 2 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby amended to read
4	as follows:
5	"SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy The State adopts
6	rooming-in as a national policy to encourage, protect and support
7	the practice of breastfeeding. It shall create an environment
8	where basic physical, emotional, and psychological needs of

1 mothers and infants are fulfilled through the practice of 2 rooming-in and breastfeeding.

3 "THE STATE SHALL LIKEWISE PROTECT WORKING 4 WOMEN BY PROVIDING SAFE AND HEALTHFUL WORKING 5 CONDITIONS, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THEIR MATERNAL 6 FUNCTIONS, AND SUCH FACILITIES AND OPPORTUNITIES THAT 7 WILL ENHANCE THEIR WELFARE AND ENABLE THEM TO 8 **REALIZE THEIR FULL POTENTIAL IN THE SERVICE OF THE** 9 NATION. THIS IS CONSISTENT WITH INTERNATIONAL TREATIES 10 AND CONVENTIONS TO WHICH THE PHILIPPINES IS A 11 SIGNATORY SUCH AS THE CONVENTION ON THE ELIMINATION 12 OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN (CEDAW), WHICH 13 EMPHASIZES PROVISION OF NECESSARY SUPPORTING SOCIAL 14 SERVICES TO ENABLE PARENTS TO COMBINE FAMILY 15 OBLIGATIONS WITH WORK RESPONSIBILITIES; THE BEIJING 16 PLATFORM FOR ACTION AND STRATEGIC OBJECTIVE, WHICH 17 PROMOTES HARMONIZATION OF WORK AND FAMILY 18 RESPONSIBILITIES FOR WOMEN AND MEN; AND THE 19 CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD, WHICH 20 **RECOGNIZES A CHILD'S INHERENT RIGHT TO LIFE AND THE** 21 STATE'S OBLIGATIONS TO ENSURE THE CHILD'S SURVIVAL AND 22 DEVELOPMENT.

23 "Breastfeeding has distinct advantages which benefit the
24 infant and the mother, including the hospital and the country that
25 adopt its practice. It is the first preventive health measure that
26 can be given to the child at birth. It also enhances mother-infant
27 relationship.

28 "Furthermore, the practice of breastfeeding could save the
29 country valuable foreign exchange that may otherwise be used
30 for milk importation.

1 "Breastmilk is the best food since it contains essential 2 nutrients completely suitable for the infant's needs. It is also 3 nature's first immunization, enabling the infant to fight potential 4 serious infection. It contains growth factors that enhance the 5 maturation of an infant's organ systems.

"TOWARDS THIS END, THE STATE SHALL PROMOTE AND б 7 ENCOURAGE BREASTFEEDING AND PROVIDE THE SPECIFIC 8 MEASURES THAT WOULD PRESENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR MOTHERS TO CONTINUE EXPRESSING THEIR MILK AND/OR 9 10 BREASTFEEDING THEIR INFANT OR YOUNG CHILD. THE IMMEDIATE LATCHING OF THE BABY TO THE MOTHER'S 11 12 BREAST WITHIN AN HOUR AFTER BIRTH, REGARDLESS OF THE 13 METHOD OF DELIVERY, SHALL LIKEWISE BE ENCOURAGED, SO SHALL EXCLUSIVE BREASTFEEDING WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS, 14 WITH THE INTRODUCTION OF PROPER COMPLEMENTARY FOOD 15 AT SIX (6) MONTHS AND BEYOND. THE STATE SHALL PROMOTE 16 BREASTFEEDING TO BE CONTINUED UP TO TWO (2) YEARS AND 17 18 BEYOND."

19 SEC. 3. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby amended to read20 as follows:

21 "SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms.* – For purposes of this Act,

the following definitions are adopted:
"a) Age of gestation – the length of time the fetus is

24 inside the mother's womb.

25 "b) Bottlefeeding - the method of feeding an infant using
26 a bottle with artificial nipples, the contents of which can be any
27 type of fluid.

28 "c) Breastfeeding – the method of feeding an infant
29 directly from the human breast.

1	"d) Breastmilk – the human milk from a mother.
2	"e) Breastmilk substitute - means any food
3	BEING MARKETED OR OTHERWISE REPRESENTED AS PARTIAL
4	OR TOTAL REPLACEMENT OF BREASTMILK WHETHER OR NOT
5	SUITABLE FOR THAT PURPOSE.
6	"F) DONOR MILK – HUMAN MILK FROM A
7	NON-BIOLOGICAL MOTHER,
8	"[e)] G) Expressed breastmilk – the human milk which
9	has been extracted from the breast by hand or by breast pump. It
10	can be fed to an infant using a dropper, a nasogatric tube, a cup
11	and spoon, or a bottle.
12	"H) EXPRESSING MILK - THE ACT OF EXTRACTING
13	HUMAN MILK FROM THE BREAST BY HAND OR BY PUMP.
14	"[f)] I) Formula feeding – the feeding of a newborn with
15	infant formula usually by bottlefeeding. It is also called artificial
16	feeding.
17	"[g)] J) Health institutions – are hospitals, health
18	infirmaries, health centers, lying-in centers, or puericulture
19	centers with obstetrical and pediatric services.
20	"[h)] κ) Health personnel – are professionals and workers
21	who manage and/or administer the entire operations of health
22	institutions and/or who are involved in providing maternal and
23	child health services.
24	"L) HEALTH WORKERS - ALL PERSONS WHO ARE
25	ENGAGED IN HEALTH AND HEALTH-RELATED WORK, AND ALL
26	PERSONS EMPLOYED IN ALL HOSPITALS, SANITARIA, HEALTH
27	INFIRMARIES, HEALTH CENTERS, RURAL HEALTH UNITS,
28	BARANGAY HEALTH STATIONS, CLINICS AND OTHER
29	HEALTH-RELATED ESTABLISHMENTS, WHETHER GOVERNMENT

OR PRIVATE, AND SHALL INCLUDE MEDICAL, ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONAL, ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL EMPLOYED REGARDLESS OF THEIR EMPLOYMENT STATUS.

4 "[i)] M) Infant – a child within zero (0) to twelve (12) 5 months of age.

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6 "[j)] N) Infant formula – the breastmilk substitute 7 formulated industrially in accordance with applicable Codex 8 Alimentarius standards, to satisfy the normal nutritional 9 requirements of infants up to six (6) months of age, and adopted 10 to their physiological characteristics.

(k) O) Lactation management – the general care of a 11 12 mother-infant nursing couple during the mother's prenatal, 13 immediate postpartum and postnatal periods. It deals with 14 educating and providing knowledge and information to pregnant 15 and lactating mothers on the advantages of breastfeeding, THE 16 RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH BREASTMILK SUBSTITUTES AND MILK 17 PRODUCTS NOT SUITABLE AS BREASTMILK SUBSTITUTES SUCH 18 AS. BUT NOT LIMITED TO, CONDENSED MILK AND EVAPORATED 19 MILK, THE MONITORING OF BREASTFEEDING MOTHERS BY 20 PRIVATE DOCTORS FOR PRIVATE PATIENTS AND BY LACTATION 21 COUNSELORS FOR SERVICE PATIENTS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE 22 WITH THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO) AND THE 23 UNITED NATIONS CHILDREN'S FUND (UNICEF) ON THE 24 IMPLEMENTATION OF BREASTFEEDING POLICIES. the 25 physiology of lactation, the establishment and maintenance of 26 lactation, the proper care of the breasts and nipples, and such 27 other matters that would contribute to successful breastfeeding.

28 "P) LACTATION STATIONS - PRIVATE, CLEAN AND
29 WELL-VENTILATED ROOMS OR AREAS IN THE WORKPLACE OR

PUBLIC PLACES WHERE NURSING MOTHERS CAN BREASTFEED 1 2 OR EXPRESS THEIR MILK. "[1] Q) Low birth weight infant – a newborn weighing 3 less than two thousand five hundred (2,500) grams at birth. 4 "[m] R) Mother's milk – the breastmilk from the 5 6 newborn's own mother. "S) FIRM, ESTABLISHMENT OR INSTITUTION - PUBLIC 7 8 PLACES AND WORKING PLACES. AS DEFINED IN 9 SUBPARAGRAPHS (T) AND (X), RESPECTIVELY. "T) PUBLIC PLACE - ENCLOSED OR CONFINED AREAS 10 11 SUCH AS SCHOOLS, PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION TERMINALS, 12 SHOPPING MALLS, AND THE LIKE. "[n]] U) Rooming-in – the practice of placing the newborn 13 in the same room as the mother right after delivery up to 14 discharge to facilitate mother-infant bonding and to initiate 15 breastfeeding. The infant may either share the mother's bed or 16 17 be placed in a crib beside the mother. "[o]] v) Seriously ill mothers – are those who are: with 18 19 severe infections; in shock, in severe cardiac or respiratory distress; or dving; or those with other conditions that may be 20 determined by the attending physician as serious. 21 22 "[p)] w) Wet-nursing – the feeding of a newborn from 23 another mother's breast when his/her own mother cannot breastfeed. 24 "X) WORKPLACE - WORK PREMISES WHERE NURSING 25 26 FEMALE EMPLOYEES ARE HABITUALLY EMPLOYED, WHETHER 27 PRIVATE ENTERPRISES OR GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, INCLUDING THEIR SUBDIVISIONS, INSTRUMENTALITIES AND 28 29 GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND -CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS.

1	"Y) YOUNG CHILD - A CHILD FROM THE AGE OF
2	TWELVE (12) MONTHS AND ONE (1) DAY UP TO TWENTY-FOUR
3	(24) MONTHS,"
4	SEC. 4. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby amended to read
5	as follows:
6	"SEC. 4. Applicability. – WHENEVER APPLICABLE,
7	[T] The provisions in this Chapter shall apply to [all] BOTH
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8	private and government [health institutions adopting rooming-in
9	and breastfeeding as defined in this Act.] FIRMS,
10	ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS.
11	"UPON APPLICATION TO AND DETERMINATION BY THE
12	SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND
13	EMPLOYMENT FOR THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND THE
14	CHAIRPERSON OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION FOR THE
15	PUBLIC SECTOR, PRIVATE AND GOVERNMENT FIRMS,
16	ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS MAY BE EXEMPTED FOR A
17	RENEWABLE PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS FROM THE PROVISION
18	OF THIS ACT WHERE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF LACTATION
19	STATIONS IS NOT FEASIBLE OR NECESSARY DUE TO THE
20	PECULIAR CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE WORKPLACE OR PUBLIC
21	PLACE, TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION, AMONG OTHERS,
22	EMPLOYEE COMPOSITION, PHYSICAL SIZE OF THE
23	ESTABLISHMENT, AND THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF PATRONS
24	WHO VISIT.
25	"THE FIRMS, ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS WHICH
26	ARE EXEMPTED IN COMPLYING WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
27	ACT BUT NEVERTHELESS OPTED TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN
28	ROOMING-IN AND LACTATION STATIONS ARE ENTITLED TO THE
29	BENEFITS HEREIN STATED: PROVIDED, THAT THEY GIVE THEIR

30 EMPLOYEES THE PRIVILEGE OF USING THE SAME."

1 SEC. 5. Section 10 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby amended to 2 read as follows:

3 "SEC. 10. Provision of Facilities for Breastmilk 4 Collection and Storage FOR HEALTH INSTITUTIONS. - The 5 health institution adopting rooming-in and breastfeeding shall 6 provide equipment, facilities, and supplies for breastmilk 7 collection, storage and utilization, the standards of which shall be 8 defined by the Department of Health. HEALTH INSTITUTIONS 9 ARE LIKEWISE ENCOURAGED TO SET UP MILK BANKS FOR 10 STORAGE OF BREASTMILK DONATED BY MOTHERS AND WHICH 11 HAVE UNDERGONE PASTEURIZATION. THE STORED 12 BREASTMILK WILL PRIMARILY BE GIVEN TO CHILDREN IN THE 13 NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT WHOSE OWN MOTHERS 14 CANNOT PRODUCE, OR DOES NOT HAVE ENOUGH 15 BREASTMILK."

16 SEC. 6. A new Section 11, under a new chapter, is added to read as 17 follows:

18 19 **"CHAPTER III**

"LACTATION STATIONS

"SEC. 11. ESTABLISHMENT OF LACTATION STATIONS. -20 21 IT IS HEREBY MANDATED THAT FIRMS, ESTABLISHMENTS OR 22 INSTITUTIONS SHALL ESTABLISH LACTATION STATIONS. THE 23 LACTATION STATIONS SHOULD BE ADEOUATELY PROVIDED 24 WITH THE NECESSARY EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES, SUCH AS: 25 LAVATORY FOR HAND-WASHING, UNLESS THERE IS AN 26 EASILY-ACCESSIBLE LAVATORY NEARBY; REFRIGERATION OR 27 APPROPRIATE COOLING FACILITIES FOR STORING: 28 ELECTRICAL OUTLETS FOR BREAST PUMPS; A SMALL TABLE; 29 COMFORTABLE SEATS; AND OTHER ITEMS, THE STANDARDS OF WHICH SHALL BE DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
 (DOH).

3 "IN ADDITION, THE FIRMS, ESTABLISHMENTS OR
4 INSTITUTIONS SHALL TAKE STRICT MEASURES TO PREVENT
5 ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT FORM OF PROMOTION, MARKETING,
6 AND/OR SALES OF INFANT FORMULA AND/OR BREASTFEEDING
7 SUBSTITUTES WITHIN THE LACTATION STATIONS, OR IN ANY
8 EVENT OR CIRCUMSTANCES WHICH MAY BE CONDUCIVE TO
9 THE SAME.

"APART FROM THE SAID MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS, THE 10 FIRMS. ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS MAY PROVIDE 11 12 OTHER SUITABLE FACILITIES OR SERVICES WITHIN THE LACTATION STATION. ALL OF WHICH. UPON 13 DUE 14 SUBSTANTIATION, SHALL BE CONSIDERED ELIGIBLE FOR PURPOSES OF SECTION 14 OF THIS ACT." 15

16 SEC. 7. A new Section 12 is hereby added to read as follows:

"SEC. 12. LACTATION PERIODS. - IN COOPERATION 17 18 WITH THE DOH AND SUBJECT TO SUCH REGULATIONS AS THE 19 SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND 20 EMPLOYMENT (DOLE) MAY PRESCRIBE FOR THE PRIVATE 21 SECTOR AND THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION (CSC) FOR THE PUBLIC SECTOR, NURSING 22 23 FEMALE EMPLOYEES SHOULD BE GIVEN REASONABLE 24 COMPENSABLE TIME DURING WORKING HOURS то 25 BREASTFEED OR EXPRESS THEIR MILK."

1	SEC. 8. Section 11, which shall be under the renumbered Chapter IV of
2	Republic Act No. 7600, is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"CHAPTER [III] IV
4	"INFORMATION, EDUCATION AND RE-EDUCATION DRIVE
5	"SEC. [11.]13. Continuing Education, Re-education and
6	Training of Health [Personnel] WORKERS AND HEALTH
7	INSTITUTIONS The Department of Health with the assistance
8	of other government agencies, professional and
9	nongovernmental organizations shall conduct continuing
10	information, education, re-education, and training programs for
11	physicians, nurses, midwives, nutritionists-dietitians, community
12	health workers and traditional birth attendants (TBAs) and other
13	health [personnel] WORKERS on current and updated lactation
14	management.
15	"Information materials shall be given to all health
16	[personnel] WORKERS involved in maternal and infant care in
17	health institutions."
18	SEC. 9. Section 12 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby renumbered
19	and amended to read as follows:
20	"SEC. [12.]14. Information Dissemination AND
21	EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS to Pregnant Women AND WOMEN OF
22	REPRODUCTIVE AGE During the prenatal, perinatal and
23	postnatal consultations and/or confinements of the mothers or
24	pregnant women in a health institution, it shall be the obligation
25	of the health institution and the health [personnel] WORKER to
26	immediately and continuously teach, train, and support the

women on current and updated lactation management and infant care, through participatory strategies such as organization of mothers' clubs and breastfeeding support groups and to distribute written information materials on such matters free of charge.

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6 "THE DOH IS HEREBY MANDATED TO DEVELOP AND 7 PROVIDE BREASTFEEDING PROGRAMS FOR WORKING 8 MOTHERS WHOSE EMPLOYERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO AVAIL OF 9 IT AS PART OF THEIR HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT 10 PROGRAMS.

11 "TO EOUIP WOMEN OF REPRODUCTIVE AGE WITH 12 ACCURATE INFORMATION ON MATERNAL NUTRITION AND 13 PROPER NOURISHMENT IN PREPARATION FOR SUCCESSFUL AND 14 SUSTAINABLE BREASTFEEDING. THE DOH IS LIKEWISE 15 MANDATED TO PRODUCE AND MAKE AVAILABLE RELEVANT 16 AND PROGRAMS INFORMATION WHICH SHOULD BE. 17 DISSEMINATED TO ALL CITY, MUNICIPAL AND BARANGAY 18 HEALTH CENTERS.

19 "EMPLOYERS ARE ALSO HIGHLY ENCOURAGED TO 20 DEVELOP BREASTFEEDING OR LACTATION SUPPORT 21 PROGRAMS WHOSE MAIN FUNCTIONS ARE TO ASSESS THE 22 NEEDS OF LACTATING WOMEN IN THEIR COMPANY AND 23 PROVIDE PREGNANT AND LACTATING EMPLOYEES WITH 24 ADEOUATE INFORMATION REGARDING LACTATION 25 MANAGEMENT IN THE FORM OF BROCHURES, PAMPHLETS AND 26 **OTHER EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS."**

27 SEC. 10. A new Section 15 is hereby added to read as follows:

28"SEC. 15. INTEGRATIONOFBREASTFEEDING29EDUCATION IN THE CURRICULA. - TO ENCOURAGE AND30PROMOTE BREASTFEEDING, THE DEPARTMENT OF31EDUCATION, THE COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION, AND

THE TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT 1 2 AUTHORITY SHALL INTEGRATE IN THE RELEVANT SUBJECTS IN 3 THE ELEMENTARY, HIGH SCHOOL, AND COLLEGE LEVELS. 4 ESPECIALLY IN THE MEDICAL AND ALLIED MEDICAL COURSES. 5 AND IN. TECHNICAL VOCATIONAL EDUCATION. THE 6 IMPORTANCE AND BENEFITS OF BREASTFEEDING."

SEC. 11. A new Section 16 is hereby added to read as follows:

8 "SEC. 16. BREASTFEEDING AWARENESS MONTH. – TO 9 RAISE AWARENESS ON THE IMPORTANCE OF AND TO FURTHER 10 PROMOTE BREASTFEEDING, THE MONTH OF AUGUST IN EACH 11 AND EVERY YEAR THROUGHOUT THE PHILIPPINES SHALL BE 12 KNOWN AS 'BREASTFEEDING AWARENESS MONTH'."

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SEC. 12. A new Section 17 is hereby added to read as follows:

"SEC. 17. PUBLIC EDUCATION AND 14 AWARENESS 15 **PROGRAM.** - TO ENSURE THE MEANINGFUL OBSERVANCE OF 16 BREASTFEEDING MONTH AS HEREIN DECLARED, A 17 COMPREHENSIVE NATIONAL PUBLIC EDUCATION AND 18 AWARENESS PROGRAM SHALL BE UNDERTAKEN TO ESTABLISH A NATIONAL HEALTH POLICY FOR BREASTFEEDING THAT 19 20SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION ON THE BENEFITS AND 21 SUPERIORITY OF BREASTFEEDING AS THE NORMAL, NATURAL 22 AND PREFERRED METHOD OF FEEDING INFANTS AND YOUNG 23 CHILDREN COMPARED TO THE HIGH RISKS AND COSTS OF 24 GIVING BREASTMILK SUBSTITUTES WHETHER TO AN INFANT 25 OR YOUNG CHILD, AND CONDUCT AND SUPPORT VARIOUS ACTIVITIES TO PROMOTE BREASTFEEDING. 26

27 "THE DOH SHALL LEAD IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
28 THE COMPREHENSIVE NATIONAL PUBLIC EDUCATION AND
29 AWARENESS PROGRAM ON BREASTFEEDING THROUGH A
30 COLLABORATIVE INTER-AGENCY AND MULTI-SECTORAL
31 EFFORT AT ALL LEVELS."

1 SEC. 13. A new Section 18, which shall be under the renumbered 2 Chapter V of Republic Act No. 7600, is hereby added to read as follows: "CHAPTER [IV] V 3 4 "MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS "SEC. 18. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CERTIFICATION. -5 ANY FIRM, ESTABLISHMENT OR INSTITUTION SATISFYING THE 6 7 **REOUIREMENTS OF SECTION 6 HEREIN RELATIVE TO A PROPER** 8 LACTATION STATION MAY APPLY WITH THE LOCAL DOH 9 OFFICE FOR A 'WORKING MOTHER-FRIENDLY' CERTIFICATION. 10 THE DOH SHALL PROMULGATE GUIDELINES TO DETERMINE 11 ELIGIBILITY FOR SUCH CERTIFICATION, WHICH SHALL 12 INCLUDE AN ANNUAL DOH INSPECTION TO CONFIRM THE 13 CONTINUED COMPLIANCE WITH ITS STANDARDS. 14 "THE DOH SHALL MAINTAIN A LIST OF 'MOTHER-15 FRIENDLY' ESTABLISHMENTS, WHICH IT SHALL MAKE 16 **AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC."** 17 SEC. 14. Section 13 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby renumbered and amended to read as follows: 18 "SEC. [13.]19. Incentives. - The expenses incurred by a 19 20 health institution FIRM, ESTABLISHMENT OR private 21 INSTITUTION, in complying with the provisions of this Act, shall 22 be deductible expenses for income tax purposes up to twice the 23 actual amount incurred: Provided, That the deduction shall apply 24 for the taxable period when the expenses were incurred: 25 Provided, further, That the hospital shall comply with the 26 provisions of this Act within six (6) months after its approval. health institutions 27 "Government FIRMS, ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS shall receive an additional 28

1appropriation equivalent to the savings they may derive as a2result of [adopting rooming-in and breastfeeding] COMPLYING3WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT. The additional4appropriation shall be included in their budget for the next fiscal5year."

SEC. 15. A new Section 20 shall be added to read as follows:

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7 "SEC. 20. OVERSIGHT. ----ÁN **INTER-AGENCY** 8 COMMITTEE (IAC) COMPOSED OF THE SECRETARIES OF 9 HEALTH, TRADE AND INDUSTRY, JUSTICE, SOCIAL WELFARE 10 AND DEVELOPMENT, LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT, EDUCATION, 11 INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT; COMMISSIONERS OF 12 THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION, COMMISSION ON HIGHER 13 EDUCATION; THE HEADS OF THE TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND 14 SKILLS DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, PROFESSIONAL AND 15 NONGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS CONCERNED SHALL BE 16 CREATED TO OVERSEE, MONITOR, AND ENSURE STRICT 17 IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ACT AND ITS RULES AND 18 **REGULATIONS.**"

19 SEC. 16. A new Section 21 shall be added to read as follows:

20 "SEC. 21. *IMPLEMENTING AGENCY.* – THE DOH SHALL
21 BE PRINCIPALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION
22 AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT."

SEC. 17. Section 14 of Republic Act No. 7600 is hereby renumbered
and amended to read as follows:

25 "SEC. [14.] 22. Sanctions. – ANYONE WHO
26 UNJUSTIFIABLY REFUSES OR FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THIS LAW
27 AND ITS RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL BE IMPOSED A FINE
28 OF NOT LESS THAN FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (Php50,000.00)

1BUT NOT MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS2(Php200,000.00) ON THE FIRST OFFENSE.

3 "ON THE SECOND OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN
4 TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (Php200,000.00) BUT NOT
5 MORE THAN FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS
6 (Php500,000.00).

7 "ON THE THIRD OFFENSE, A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN
8 FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (Php500,000.00) BUT NOT
9 MORE THAN ONE MILLION PESOS (Php1,000,000.00):
10 PROVIDED, THAT FOR PRIVATE HEALTH OR NON-HEALTH
11 INSTITUTIONS, THE BUSINESS PERMITS OR LICENSES TO
12 OPERATE SHALL BE CANCELLED OR REVOKED.

13 "IN ALL CASES, THE FINE IMPOSED SHOULD TAKE INTO
14 CONSIDERATION, AMONG OTHERS, EMPLOYEE COMPOSITION,
15 PHYSICAL SIZE OF THE ESTABLISHMENT AND THE AVERAGE
16 NUMBER OF PATRONS WHO VISIT.

17 **"IN ADDITION,** [T]The Secretary of Health is hereby 18 empowered to imposed sanctions ON GOVERNMENT FIRMS, 19 ESTABLISHMENTS OR INSTITUTIONS for the violation of this Act 20 and the rules issued thereunder. [Such sanctions may be in the 21 form of reprimand or censure and in cases of repeated willful 22 violations, suspension of the permit to operate of the erring 23 health institution.]"

SEC. 18. *Rules and Regulations.* – The DOH, as the lead agency, in consultation with the Department of Trade and Industry, the Department of Justice, the Department of Social Welfare and Development, the Department of Labor and Employment, the Department of Education, the Department of the Interior and Local Government, the Civil Service Commission, the Commission on Higher Education, the Technical Education and Skills
 Development Authority and professional and nongovernmental organizations
 concerned, shall be authorized to prepare the rules and regulations necessary to
 carry out the provisions of this Act.

5 SEC. 19. Separability Clause. – If any clause, sentence, paragraph or 6 part of this Act shall be declared to be invalid, the remainder of this Act or any 7 provision not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.

8 SEC. 20. Repealing Clause. - All laws, presidential decrees, executive
9 orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are not consistent with this
10 Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 21. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)
 days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2)
 newspapers of general circulation, whichever comes earlier.
