AN ACT CONVERTING THE WESTERN VISAYAS MEDICAL CENTER
IN ILOILO CITY INTO A GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND
-CONTROLLED HOSPITAL CORPORATION WITH THE SAN
JOAQUIN MUNICIPAL HOSPITAL IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF
SAN JOAQUIN, PROVINCE OF ILOILO, AS ITS SUBSIDIARY
AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as "The Western Visayas Medical Center Charter".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. — It is hereby declared the policy of the State to adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all the people at affordable cost; to prioritize the needs of the underprivileged, the sick, elderly, disabled, women and children; to provide free medical care to paupers; to establish and maintain an effective food and drug regulatory system; and to undertake appropriate health manpower development and research responsive to the country's health needs and problems.

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In pursuit of the Health Sector Reform Program undertaken by the national government in coordination with other health partners, this Act shall be anchored on these principles:

- (a) Public health is a measure of the equitable distribution of wealth and sustainable economic growth;
- (b) The citizens are entitled to a hospital care delivery system that is affordable, accessible and acceptable;
- (c) Service provision to less-privileged and indigent patients shall be prioritized hence requiring necessary policy directions and financial support, closer cooperation with local government units and other partners;
- (d) Fiscal and management autonomy of the Western Visayas Medical Center will lead to better quality and more efficient delivery of health services; and
- (e) The corporate form of organization will give hospital administrators the necessary flexibility for the effective stewardship of hospital assets, funds, management and personnel supervision.
- SEC. 3. Conversion of the Western Visayas Medical Center. The Western Visayas Medical Center at Mandurriao, Iloilo City, hereinafter referred to as the WVMC, is hereby converted into a government-owned and -controlled hospital corporation with the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital at the Municipality of San Joaquin, Province of Iloilo as its subsidiary.
- SEC. 4. Duration and Conditions of Existence. The conversion of the WVMC as a government-owned and -controlled hospital corporation, with the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital as its subsidiary, shall be completed within a period of five (5) years from the effectivity of this Act which may be extended for another term of five (5) years by the Department of Health (DOH), subject to the termination clause that such failure amounts to an ineffective management of the hospital and jeopardizes the delivery of hospital

1 and medical services, or as subsequent legislation may provide: Provided, 2 That during this transition, it will be monitored closely based on predetermined 3 performance indices by the National Center for Health Facility Development 4 (NCHFD) in order to determine the applicability of corporate restructuring: 5 Provided, however. That if these performance targets are not met or if 6 backsliding is noted within five (5) years and/or if no significant improvement 7 occurs after ten (10) years, the Secretary of Health may recommend to 8 Congress the revocation of this Act: Provided further. That upon revocation 9 of this Act, the WVMC shall revert as a budgetary line agency under the DOH 10 and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital shall revert to the local government of 11 San Joaquin for disposition in accordance with law: Provided, finally, That the 12 DOH shall formulate the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) to carry out

SEC. 5. General Objectives. - This Act has the following general objectives:

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this reversion.

- (a) To provide the Filipino people with a more affordable, quality and timely hospital care through a more efficient health service delivery system; and
- (b) To institute reforms in the organization, administration and financial management of the WVMC as a means of reducing the cost and improving the quality of public health care.
- SEC. 6. Purposes. The WVMC, with the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital as its subsidiary, shall have the following purposes:
- (a) To provide and maintain affordable, quality and timely hospital care through a more efficient health service delivery system with priority for the needs of the underprivileged, sick, elderly, disabled, women and children, and resources permitting to provide free medical care to indigent citizens;

(b) To promote the development of hospital facilities of the WVMC, advancement in medical technology and establishment of health care providers for the underprivileged;

- (c) To foster hospital and medical service operation conducive to the efficient delivery of service to the public;
- (d) To promote, encourage and engage in scientific research in the prevention of diseases and the care and treatment of patients and related activities, including scholarship and conduct of relevant congresses, conventions, seminars and conferences;
- (e) To ercourage and undertake the training of physicians, nurses, medical technicians, health officers, social workers and other health professionals on the practical and scientific conduct and implementation of health and medical services, and related activities; and
- (f) To extend services pursuant to the goals, objectives and rules of the National Health Insurance Program (NHIP).
 - SEC. 7. Powers and Functions. The WVMC and its subsidiary, the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital, shall have the following powers and functions:
 - (a) To acquire, hold and own in any manner, property of whatever nature or description, and to dispose of such property under any mode of encumbrance or conveyance;
 - (b) To enter into and carry out contracts of every kind and for any lawful purpose with any person, firm, association or corporation, whether public or private, domestic or foreign;
- (c) To mortgage, lease, sell, transfer, convey or otherwise dispose of its properties;

(d) To solicit and receive donations, endowments and funds in the form of contributions, whether in cash or in kind, from both the public and private sectors and from domestic or foreign sources;

- (e) To open such accounts in banks and other financial institutions, and to disburse such funds or invest the same as the Board of Trustees may direct to accomplish or advance the purposes or interest of the WVMC Corporation;
- (f) To invite foreign or local health specialists and similar experts in the various medical fields to train the personnel, trainees or residents of the WVMC Corporation;
- (g) To send the personnel of the WVMC Corporation to research institutes, medical institutes or universities for advance training or observation and to attend international or regional conventions, conferences, congresses or seminars as the Board of Trustees may deem necessary to accomplish the purposes and objectives of the WVMC Corporation;
- (h) To enter into such agreements and arrangements with other medical or similar institutions, domestic or foreign, as may be deemed desirable by the Board of Trustees toward promoting the purposes and objectives of the WVMC Corporation;
- (i) To adopt a set of bylaws, rules and regulations consistent with law and the provisions hereof to govern the administration and operation of the WVMC Corporation; and
- (j) To do all such other acts and things as are or may be necessary for or incidental to the accomplishment of the purposes and objectives of the WVMC Corporation.
- SEC. 8. Board of Trustees. The WVMC Corporation shall be administered by a Board of Trustees composed of ten (10) members as follows:

6	socio-civic/nongovernment organizations;
7	(i) A representative from the business sector; and
8	Non-voting member:
9	(j) The WVMC director and chief.
0.	The members of the Board of Trustees enumerated in subparagraphs (a),
1	(b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (j) shall serve as ex officio members. The members of
2	the Board of Trustees enumerated in subparagraphs (g), (h) and (i) shall be
3	appointed by the Secretary of Health for the first or initial appointees, and then
4	by the Board of Trustees for subsequent appointees.
:5	The appointive members of the Board of Trustees shall serve for a term
6	of three (3) years and may be reappointed up to a maximum of two (2) terms,

while the ex officio members mentioned in subparagraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e),

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(f) and (j) shall serve as members of the Board of Trustees for the duration of their incumbency.

No person shall be appointed member of the Board of Trustees unless he/she is a citizen and a resident of the Philippines, of good moral character and has attained proficiency, expertise and recognized competence in one or more of the following fields: hospital finance and administration, medical care, public health care, government rules and regulations, law, business management and marketing. The members of the Board of Trustees shall have at least five (5) years experience in their fields of expertise.

The Board of Trustees shall be governed by a set of bylaws which shall contain, but not limited to, their responsibilities, accountabilities and cause of termination.

SEC. 9. Craparate Officers. — The Board of Trustees shall appoint a Secretary of the Board and such other officers as may be deemed necessary to carry out its objectives. Selection of the corporate officers must be based on the fundamental and specific qualifications prescribed by existing laws.

SEC. 10. Chief Executive Officer. — The present chief and director of the WVMC shall assume the position of Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Corporation: Provided, That the CEO shall be in charge of the usual and regular course of business of the Corporation and shall be accountable to the Board of Trustees of the Corporation who has the power of removal or replacement for reasons of fraud, incompetence, dishonesty and other similar grounds and after due process: Provided, however, That in case of vacancy of the office previously occupied by the Director of the WVMC, the next CEO shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees of the WVMC: Provided, finally, That the CEO appointed by the Board shall only serve the unexpired term of office of the predecessor.

SEC. 11. Corporate Structure. — The WVMC shall follow the standard corporate structure to be formulated by the DOH Central Office in coordination with different agencies.

SEC. 12. Executive Committee and Other Committees. — The Board of Trustees may, by resolution approved by the majority of all its members, create an Executive Committee of not more than five (5) members and other committees with such powers and functions as may be delegated to them by the Board: Provided, That, at least three (3) members of the Executive Committee shall be members of the Board of Trustees: Provided, however, That, the committees so created shall keep regular minutes of its proceedings and report the same to the Board whenever required: Provided, finally, That the Board of Trustees shall have the power to change the members of such committees at any time or dissolve such committees with or without cause.

SEC. 13. Board of Trustees' Meetings and Quorum. — The Board of Trustees shall hold meetings at least once a month. Special meetings may be convened at the call of the Chairman or by the majority of the members of the Board of Trustees. The Chairman or the designated representative shall preside over the meetings of the Board. In the absence of the Chairman or the representative, a temporary presiding officer shall be designated by the majority of the quorum.

Six (6) members of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum to transact business and the vote of the majority of those present, there being a quorum, shall constitute valid and binding act of the WVMC: *Provided, however*, That the affirmative vote of at least six (6) members of the Board is required on the following matters:

- (a) Adoption or changes of policy;
- (b) Investment of the WVMC funds;

- (c) Contracting loans, except as may be provided for in the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) of this Act where a vote of a majority of those present, there being a quorum, shall suffice as to a specified certain amount of loan borrowed;
- (d) Appointment, discipline and termination of the WVMC hospital chief or director. The appointment, discipline and termination of other officers and employees shall be by a vote of a majority of those present, there being a quorum; and
- (e) Authority to use corporate assets as collateral for loans and borrowings.

SEC. 14. Compensation of Nongovernment Members of the Board of Trustees. – The appointive nongovernment members of the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to honorarium for each meeting actually attended at such amount as may be fixed by the Board in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

The members of the Board of Trustees, by resolution of the majority of the members in good standing of the Corporation, may claim expenses for attendance in regular or special meetings of the Board: *Provided, however*, That actual and necessary traveling expenses of the members of the Board while engaged in serving the interests of the Corporation and in pursuit of its defined objectives and purposes may be allowed by special resolution of the Board.

SEC. 15. Property of the WVMC and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital. — The property of the WVMC and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital shall consist of such real, personal and other type of property now owned by it or reserved for or may hereafter be given, donated, acquired, transferred or conveyed to it by the Philippine government, its branches and instrumentalities, or any foreign government, as well as by trust, foundation,

corporations or persons, alien or domestic, in order to carry out its purposes and objectives as set forth herein.

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SEC. 16. Assistance from Other Government Offices. — The WVMC may call upon any department, bureau, office, agency or instrumentality of the government, including government-owned or -controlled corporations, for technical assistance in the pursuit of its purposes and objectives.

Said offices, agencies, institutions or other entities are hereby enjoined to render full assistance and cooperation to the WVMC in the accomplishment of its objectives and activities.

SEC. 17. Loans. — The Corporation is hereby authorized to contract loans, credits and other indebtedness in any convertible foreign currency, from time to time, from foreign governments, or any international financial institutions or fund sources, or any other entities, on such terms and conditions it shall deem appropriate for the accomplishment of its purposes and to enter into and execute agreements specifying such terms and conditions.

The property and assets of the Corporation may be used as collateral for its loans and borrowings.

SEC. 18. Exemption of Donations from Taxes and Duties. - Any donation, contribution, bequest and grant which may be made to the WVMC shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall be considered as allowable deduction from the gross income in the computation of the income tax of the donor in accordance with the provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC), as amended: *Provided*, That such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold.

SEC. 19. Continuous and Subsequent Government Appropriations. —
The amounts necessary for the operation and maintenance to further improve
the hospital facilities of the WVMC and to continuously subsidize their

- indigent patients based on the Department of Health Medical Social Worker
 classification shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- SEC. 20. Auditor. The Commission on Audit shall appoint an auditor of the WVMC and such personnel as may be necessary to assist said auditor.

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- SEC. 21. Civil Service Law Coverage for Employees. The hiring, appointment, promotion, discipline and other terms and conditions of the service of all employees of the WVMC and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital shall be consistent with the provisions of the civil service law, rules and regulations, except as otherwise provided for in this Act.
- SEC. 22. Salaries, Benefits and Other Compensation. The salaries, benefits and other compensation of the officers and employees of the WVMC and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital shall be in accordance with the existing compensation and position classification system.
- SEC. 23. Early Retirement and Separation Benefits. The officials and employees of the WVMC and the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital voluntarily opting for separation or retirement shall be entitled to the benefits provided for under existing laws.
- SEC. 24. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR). Within fifteen (15) days from completion of membership, the Board of Trustees shall convene to formulate the rules and regulations necessary for the implementation of this Act which shall be issued within six (6) months after the approval of this Act. The IRR shall adopt appropriate provisions of issuances of government agencies on corporate organizational structures as well as corporate governance.
- SEC. 25. Suppletory Application of Corporation Code. The provisions of the Corporation Code shall have suppletory application on matters not provided for in this Act.

1	SEC. 26. Reports The Corporation shall submit periodic or other
2	reports as may be required from time to time by the DOH, within three (3)
3	months after the end of every fiscal year.
4	SEC. 27. Transfer of Personnel, Assets, Records and Equipment All
5	personnel, assets, funds, records, equipment and liabilities of the WVMC and
-6	the San Joaquin Municipal Hospital are hereby transferred to and shall
7	henceforth appertain to the WVMC as a Corporation and the San Joaquin
8	Municipal Hospital as its subsidiary.
9	SEC. 28. Separability Clause If any part, section or provision of
10	this Act is held invalid or unconstitutional, the other parts or provisions not
11	affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.
12	SEC. 29. Repealing Clause All other laws, decrees, orders,
13	issuances, rules and regulations that are inconsistent with the provisions of this
14	Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
15	SEC. 30. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
16	its publication in the Official Gazette or in any newspaper of general
