AN ACT DECLARING MT. TAPULAO IN ZAMBALES AS AN ECOTOURISM ZONE AND PROTECTED AREA AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote a sustainable ecotourism industry to attract local and foreign tourists while making them aware of the urgent need to preserve the blessings of nature.

SEC. 2. Mt. Tapulao Ecotourism Zone and Protected Area. – Mt. Tapulao is hereby declared an ecotourism zone and the area of five thousand (5,000) hectares of the said mountain is hereby declared as a protected area under the National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS). The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) shall, within ninety (90) days after the approval of this Act, make an inventory of the existing flora and fauna in Mt. Tapulao that shall serve as the basis for a master plan that will be developed for the purpose of this Act.

SEC. 3. Mt. Tapulao Ecotourism Governing Board. - For the purpose of Section 2 of this Act, an ecotourism governing board, to be known as the Mt. Tapulao Ecotourism Governing Board, is hereby created. The Board shall be composed of the Representative of the Second District of Zambales who shall act as chair, the Secretaries of the Department of Tourism (DOT) and the DENR or their duly authorized representatives, a member of a nongovernment organization whose advocacy is environmental preservation, a member of the academe, a representative of the business sector, a representative of the private sector and the local chief executives of municipalities where Mt. Tapulao is situated. The governing board shall prepare the rules and regulations necessary for the full implementation by the concerned local government units of the provisions of this Act and shall, as the need arises, amend, modify or revise such rules and regulations to meet the needs of changing times.

SEC. 4. Mt. Tapulao Ecotourism Master Plan. — The DENR and the DOT shall, within one hundred twenty (120) days from approval of this Act, develop a master plan to be approved by the President of the Republic of the Philippines upon the recommendation of the governing board.

- SEC. 5. Appropriation. The Secretary of the DOT shall include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act and/or internally generated funds of the Department.
- SEC. 6. Repealing Clause. All laws, rules, regulations, executive orders, presidential decrees or any other issuance contrary to or inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby deemed repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 7. Separability Clause. If any provision or part of this Act may be declared unconstitutional, the remaining provisions which are not affected shall remain in full force and effect.
