AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SENIOR HIGH SCHOOLS IN ALL LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS OF THE PHILIPPINES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. There shall be established, under the control and supervision of the Department of Education (DepED), a senior high school for each of the legislative districts in the country.
- The establishment of a senior high school, for the purpose of this Act means, either:
- (a) Expanding the existing high school to include the senior high school; or
 - (b) Establishing a stand-alone senior high school.
- Consistent with Rule IV, Section 15 of the implementing rules and regulations of Republic Act No. 10533, the DepED shall authorize and

regulate the offering of senior high school in private educational institutions.
It shall also prescribe the guidelines on the issuance and revocation of permits
and/or recognition of senior high schools.
SEC. 2. The courses to be offered by the senior high schools shall be in
accordance with the enhanced basic education curriculum formulated and
designed by the DepED in pursuance of Section 5 of Republic Act No. 10533
and in coordination with the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), the
Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), and other
concerned national government agencies and stakeholders.
SEC. 3. The amount needed for the initial implementation of this Act
shall be charged against the current year's appropriation of the DepED.
Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation
of this Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
SEC. 4. All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations
inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.
SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
