AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE KALINGA SPORTS TRAINING CENTER IN THE CITY OF TABUK, PROVINCE OF KALINGA AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION I. There shall be established in the City of Tabuk, Province of Kalinga, a sports training center to be known as the "Kalinga Sports Training Center". It shall be located in the City of Tabuk, and constituted as the primary sports development and training center for the whole Province of Kalinga.

SEC. 2. The Provincial Government of Kalinga, in coordination with the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC), shall take the necessary steps to integrate any existing facilities and equipment in the province, including personnel complement, into the newly created sports training center.

The Provincial Government of Kalinga and the City Government of Tabuk, in coordination with the PSC, shall create the necessary training programs, appropriate tournaments and competitions, as well as the system by which the facilities shall be maintained and managed in order to accomplish the objectives and purposes of this Act.

SEC. 3. The construction, establishment and operation of the Kalinga Sports Training Center shall be funded by the Provincial Government of Kalinga and the City Government of Tabuk, and such funds as may be granted by the PSC, and by the Office of the President. In addition, grants and endowments may be obtained from local or foreign sources intended for sports development.

SEC. 4. The Provincial Government of Kalinga, the City Government of Tabuk, in coordination with the PSC, and other concerned stakeholders, shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the implementation of this Act within ninety (90) days after its enactment into law.

SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
