AN ACT CONVERTING THE CATANDUANES STATE COLLEGES IN THE PROVINCE OF CATANDUANES INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE CATANDUANES STATE UNIVERSITY AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Conversion – The Catanduanes State Colleges (CSC) in the 2 Province of Catanduanes, composed of CSC Virac Campus in the Municipality 3 of Virac and CSC Panganiban Campus in the Municipality of Panganiban, both 4 located in the Province of Catanduanes, is hereby converted into a state 5 university to be known as the Catanduanes State University, hereinafter 6 referred to as the University. The main campus of the University shall be in 7 Virac, Catanduanes.

8 SEC. 2. *General Mandate.* – The University shall primarily provide 9 advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction and training 10 in trade, commerce, fishery, agriculture, arts and sciences, industrial 11 technology, nursing, midwifery, education, engineering, public administration, information technology, and other relevant fields of study. It shall also
 undertake research and extension services, and provide progressive leadership
 in its areas of specialization.

SEC, 3, Curricular Offerings. The University shall offer 4 _ undergraduate and graduate courses in the fields of trade, commerce, fishery, 5 agriculture, arts and sciences, industrial technology, nursing, midwifery, 6 education, engineering, public administration, information technology, and 7 other degrees/courses within its areas of specialization and according to its 8 capabilities, as the Board of Regents may deem necessary to carry out its 9 objectives, particularly to meet the needs of the Province of Catanduanes and 10 11 Region V.

The existing high school shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Education (DepEd): *Provided*, That the high school shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the University until the existing students shall have completed their high school education: *Provided*, *further*, That the University may operate a reasonablysized laboratory school, if it has a College of Education.

18 SEC. 4. Administration. – The University shall have the general powers 19 of a corporation set forth in Batas Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise 20 known as the "Corporation Code of the Philippines". The administration of the 21 University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested exclusively 22 in the Board of Regents and the president of the University.

SEC. 5. *The Governing Board.* – The governing board of the University
 shall be the Board of Regents, hereinafter referred to as the Board, which shall
 be composed of the following:

26 (a) The chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED),27 chairperson;

28 (b) The president of the University, vice chairperson;

- (c) The chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture 1 2 of the Senate, member;
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(d) The chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical Education of the House of Representatives, member,

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(e) The regional director of the National Economic and Development 6 Authority (NEDA), member;

7 (f) The regional director of the Department of Science and Technology 8 (DOST), member;

(g) The president of the federation of faculty associations of the 9 10 University, member;

(h) The president of the federation of student councils of the 11 12 University, member;

(i) The president of the federation of alumni associations of the 13 14 University, member; and

(1) Two prominent citizens from the private sector who have 15 16 distinguished themselves in their profession or fields of specialization of the University, members. 17

The Board shall appoint the two prominent citizens from among a list of 18 at least five persons gualified in the Province of Catanduanes, as recommended 19 by the search committee constituted by the University president, in 20 21consultation with the chairperson of the CHED and the other members of the 22 Board, based on the normal standards and qualifications for the position.

The term of office of the president of the federation of faculty 23 associations, the president of the federation of student councils and the 24 25 president of the federation of alumni associations shall be coterminous with 26 their respective terms of office, as set forth in their respective constitutions and bylaws. 27

1 The two prominent citizens shall serve for a term of two years from the 2 date of appointment.

3 SEC. 6. *Promulgation and Implementation of Policies.* -- The Board 4 shall promulgate and implement policies in accordance with the declared State 5 policies on education and other pertinent provisions of the Philippine 6 Constitution on education, agriculture, science and technology, as well as the 7 policies, standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic Act No. 7722, 8 otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994".

9 SEC. 7. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents. – The Board shall 10 have the following specific powers and duties, in addition to its general powers 11 of administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of 12 directors of a corporation under existing laws:

- (a) To promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to carryout the purposes and functions of the University;
- (b) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided for the
 support of the University in the manner it may determine in its discretion, in
 order to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;

(c) To import duty-free economic, technical and cultural books and/or
publications, upon certification by the CHED that such imported books and/or
publications are for economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical,
historical or cultural purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Tariff
and Customs Code, as amended;

(d) To receive in trust legacies, gifts and donations of real and personal
properties of all kinds and to administer and dispose of the same when
necessary for the benefit of the University, and subject to the limitations,
directions and instructions of the donor, if any.

27 Such donations shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall 28 be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income in the

computation of the income tax of the donor, in accordance with the provisions 1 2 of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC), as amended: Provided, That 3 such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold;

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(e) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school charges, such as, 5 but not limited to, matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as 6 the Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultations with the 7 involved sectors.

Such fees and charges, including government subsidies and other 8 9 income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized government depository bank, and all 10 interests that shall accrue therefrom shall form part of the same funds for the 11 12 use of the University.

Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulations to the contrary 13 notwithstanding, any income generated by the University from tuition fees and 14 15 other charges, as well as from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants, shall be retained by the University, and may be disbursed by the Board 16 for instruction, research, extension or other programs/projects of the 17 18 University: Provided, That all fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific 19 purposes for which they are collected.

If, for reasons beyond its control, the University shall not be able to 20 21 pursue any project for which the funds have been appropriated and allocated under its approved program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use 22 23 of said funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its discretion, may be 24 necessary and urgent for the attainment of the objectives and goals of the University: 25

(f) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of tuition and school 26 fees for greater access to poor but deserving students; 27

1 (g) To authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machinery, equipment and other facilities, and the purchase and acquisition of real 2 property, including necessary supplies, materials and equipment: 3

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(h) To appoint upon recommendation of the president of the University, vice presidents, deans, directors, heads of campuses. faculty 5 members and other officials and employees of the University; 6

7 (i) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative 8 officials and employees, subject to the provisions of the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and other pertinent budget and 9 10 compensation laws governing hours of service and such other duties and 11 conditions as it may deem proper; to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of 12 absence under such regulations as it may promulgate, any provision of existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause in 13 accordance with the requirements of due process of law; 14

(i) To approve the curricula, instructional programs and rules of 15 discipline drawn by the Administrative and the Academic Councils herein 16 17 provided;

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(k) To set policies on admission and graduation of students;

(1) To award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of their 19 outstanding contribution in the fields of education, public service, arts, science 20 21 and technology, agriculture or in any field of specialization within the 22 academic competence of the University; and to authorize the awarding of certificates of completion of nondegree and nontraditional courses; 23

(m) To establish and absorb nonchartered tertiary institutions within the 24 25 Province of Catanduanes as branches and centers in coordination with the CHED, and in consultation with the Department of Budget and Management 26 (DBM), and to offer therein programs or courses, to promote and carry out 27 equal access to educational opportunities as mandated by the Constitution; 28

1 (n) To establish research and extension centers of the University where 2 such will promote the development of the latter;

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(o) To establish chairs in the University and to provide fellowships for gualified faculty members and scholarships to deserving students;

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5 (p) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided for hereinabove 6 to the president and/or other officials of the University as it may deem 7 appropriate, so as to expedite the administration of the affairs of the 8 University;

9 (q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be 10 financed by the CHED, subject to Commission on Audit (COA) rules and 11 regulations; and to institute reforms, including academic and structural 12 changes, on the basis of the audit results and recommendations;

(r) To collaborate with other governing boards of the state colleges and
universities within the Province of Catanduanes or Region V, under the
supervision of the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and work towards
the restructuring of the University to become more efficient, relevant,
productive and competitive;

(s) To enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the
profitable development and management of the economic assets of the
University, the proceeds from which shall be used for the development and
strengthening of the University;

(t) To develop consortia and other economic forms of linkages with
local government units, institutions and agencies, both public and private, local
and foreign, in the furtherance of the purpose and objectives of the University;

25 (u) To develop academic arrangements for institutional capability 26 building with appropriate institutions' and agencies, public and private, local 27 and foreign, and to appoint experts/specialists as consultants, part-time or 28 visiting, or exchange professors, scholars or researchers, as the case may be;

- (v) To set up the adoption of modern and innovative modes of 1 transmitting knowledge such as the use of information technology, the dual 2 system, open learning, or distance education and community laboratory for the 3 promotion of greater access to education; 4
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(w) To establish policy guidelines and procedures for participative decision-making and transparency within the University; 6

(x) To privatize, where most advantageous to the University, 7 management of nonacademic services such as health, food, building or grounds 8 or property maintenance and such other similar activities; and 9

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(y) To extend the term of the president of the University beyond the 11 age of retirement but not beyond the age of seventy (70), whose performance has been unanimously rated by the governing board as outstanding based on 12 the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the Board, after 13 unanimous recommendation by the search committee. 14

SEC. 8. Meetings of the Board – The Board shall regularly convene at 15 least once every quarter. However, the chairperson of the Board may, upon 16 three days' prior written notice, call a maximum of two special meetings 17 18 whenever necessary.

A quorum of the Board shall consist of majority of all its members 19 holding office at the time of the meeting: Provided, however, That the 20 chairperson of the Board or the president of the University is among those 21 22 present in the meeting.

In the absence of the chairperson of the CHED, a commissioner of the 23 CHED, duly designated by him/her, shall represent him/her in the meeting with 24 all the rights and responsibilities of a regular member: Provided, however, 25 That during this meeting, the president of the University as vice chairperson 26shall be the presiding officer: Provided, further, That this proviso 27 notwithstanding, the chairperson of the CHED is hereby authorized to 28

designate a CHED commissioner as the regular chair of the Board of Regents. ł in which case said CHED commissioner shall act as the presiding officer. 2

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In case the chairpersons of the Congressional Committees on Education 4 shall not be able to attend the Board meeting, they may duly designate their respective representatives to attend the said meeting, who shall have the same 5 6 rights and responsibilities as a regular member of the Board.

The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be 7 8 entitled to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either in 9 their attendance to meetings of the Board or in connection with other official business authorized by resolution of the Board, subject to existing laws and 10 11 regulations.

12 SEC. 9. The University President. - The University shall be headed by a president, who shall render full-time service. He/she shall be appointed by 13 the Board, subject to the guidelines, gualifications and/or standards set by the 14 Board, upon recommendation of a duly constituted search committee. He/she 15 shall have a term of four years and shall be eligible for reappointment for 16 17 another term: *Provided*. That in order to effect a smooth transition to a state 18 university, the CHED shall designate an officer-in-charge of the University, pending the appointment of the first president of the Catanduanes State 19 University. 20

Within six months before the expiration of the term of office of the 21 incumbent president of the Catanduanes State University, the Board shall 22 constitute the Search Committee for the Presidency (SCP). 23

In case of vacancy in the office of the president by reason of death, 24 compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the 25 president to perform the functions of his/her office, the Board shall designate 26 27 an officer-in-charge of the University within six months from date of vacancy, pending the appointment of a new president. 28

In case of vacancy in the office of the president as mentioned in the
 immediately preceding paragraph, his/her successor or the officer-in-charge
 shall hold office for the unexpired term only.

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The powers and duties of the president of the University, in addition to those specifically provided in this Act, shall be those usually pertaining to the office of the president of similar universities, and those delegated by the Board.

8 The salary of the president of the University shall be in accordance with 9 the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and shall be 10 comparable to that being received by the presidents of similar educational 11 institutions.

12 The president of the University shall be assisted by a vice president for 13 Academic Affairs and a vice president for Administration, who shall be 14 appointed by the Board upon recommendation of the president.

15 SEC. 10. *The Administrative Council.* – There shall be an 16 Administrative Council consisting of the president of the University as 17 chairperson, vice presidents, deans, directors and other officials of equal rank 18 as members, whose duty is to review and recommend to the Board the policies 19 governing the administration, management and development planning of the 20 University.

SEC. 11. The Academic Council. – There shall be an Academic Council
with the president of the University as chairperson and all members of the
academic staff, with the rank of not lower than assistant professor, as members.

The Academic Council shall have the power to review and recommend the curricular offerings and rules of discipline of the University, subject to the approval of the Board of Regents. It shall fix the requirements for the admission of students, as well as for their graduation and conferment of degrees, subject to review and/or approval by the Board of Regents through the

president of the University. It shall have the disciplinary power over students 1 2 of the University and shall formulate academic policies and rules and regulations on discipline, subject to the approval of the Board of Regents. 3

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SEC. 12. The Secretary of the University. - The Board shall appoint a 5 secretary, who shall serve as such for both the Board and the University and shall keep all records and proceedings of the Board. He/she shall serve upon 6 each member of the Board the appropriate notice of the Board's meetings.

SEC. 13. The Treasurer of the University. - The Treasurer of the 8 9 Philippines shall be the ex officio treasurer of the University.

10 SEC. 14. Faculty. – No political beliefs, gender preference, cultural or 11 community affiliation or ethnic origin, and religious opinion or affiliation shall 12 be a matter of inquiry in the appointment of faculty members of the University: Provided. That said appointment shall be subject to the guidelines, 13 qualifications and/or standards set by the Board: Provided, further. That no 14 member of the faculty shall teach for or against any particular church or 15 16 religious sect.

SEC, 15. Scholarship Program/Admission. - The University shall 17 provide a scholarship program and other affirmative action programs to assist 18 19 noor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the University.

20 No student shall be denied admission to the University by reason of sex, 21 religion, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin.

SEC. 16. Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy. - The 22 23 University shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant to Paragraph 2, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution of the Republic of 24 25 the Philippines.

26 SEC. 17. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus/Equipment/Supplies and Detail of Personnel. - The heads of the bureaus and offices of the national 27 28 government are hereby authorized to loan or transfer, upon the request of the president of the University, such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be needed by the University, and to detail employees for duty therein when, in the judgment of the head of bureau or office, such apparatus, equipment, supplies or services of such employees can be spared without serious detriment to the public service. The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as required of them by the president of the University, and the time so employed shall be counted as part of their regular services.

8 SEC. 18. Assets, Liabilities and Personnel. – All assets, real and 9 personal, personnel and records of the Catanduanes State Colleges, as well as 10 liabilities or obligations, are hereby transferred to the University. The 11 positions, rights and security of tenure of faculty members and personnel 12 therein employed under existing laws prior to the conversion into a University 13 shall be respected.

All parcels of land belonging to the government and occupied by the Catanduanes State Colleges are hereby declared to be property of the University, and shall be titled under that name: *Provided*, That should the University cease to exist or be abolished or should such parcels of land aforementioned be no longer needed by the University, the same shall revert to the local government unit concerned.

SEC. 19. Appropriations. – The amount necessary for the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Catanduanes State Colleges, except the sums needed to continue the operations of the existing high school. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued operation and maintenance of the Catanduanes State University shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 20. Development Plan, Management Audit, Organizational/
 Administrative/Academic Structure. – Within the period of one hundred twenty

1 (120) days after the approval of this Act, the University shall accomplish the 2 following:

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(a) Submit a five-year development plan, including its corresponding program budget to the CHED for corresponding recommendation to DBM;

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(b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with the CHED; and

6 7 (c) Accordingly set up its organizational, administrative as well as academic structure, including the appointment of the University key officials.

8 SEC. 21. *Filing of Report.* – On or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the 9 second month after the opening of the regular classes each year, the Board 10 shall file with the Office of the President of the Philippines through the 11 chairperson of the CHED, and with both Houses of Congress a detailed report 12 on the progress, conditions and needs of the University.

SEC. 22. Suppletory Application. - The provisions of Republic Act No.
8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997",
shall be an integral part of this Act and shall serve as part of the Governing
Charter of the University.

SEC. 23. Parity Clause. - All other powers, functions and privileges.
responsibilities and limitations to state universities and/or their officials under
existing laws shall be deemed granted to or imposed upon the University
and/or its officials whenever appropriate.

SEC. 24. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The Board, in
 consultation with the CHED, shall formulate the guidelines to fully implement
 the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 25. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any part or provision
 of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or
 provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 26. Repealing Clause. - All laws, presidential decrees, executive
 orders, rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of
 this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

4 SEC. 27. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after 5 its publication in two newspapers of general circulation.
