AN ACT DECLARING CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND OF THE PUBLIC DOMAIN WITHIN SMALL ISLANDS AS AGRICULTURAL LAND OPEN TO DISPOSITION FOR COMMERCIAL ECO-TOURISM AND OTHER PRODUCTIVE PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Certain parcels of land of the public domain within small 2 islands. with land areas of fifty thousand (50,000) hectares or less, already devoted to or with great potential for eco-tourism ventures such as resorts, eco-3 4 parks and hotels, are hereby declared agricultural lands open to disposition for 5 commercial eco-tourism purposes and other productive purposes: Provided, 6 That the parcels of land herein declared as agricultural lands have already been 7 subjected to a public cadastral survey pursuant to Cadastral Act No. 2259, and 8 were properly delineated and identified in the said cadastral survey.

9 SEC. 2. For ecological consideration and environmental protection of
10 small islands, their coastal areas or the band of dry land within their shorelines
11 covering twenty (20) meters landward from the point where the seawater

reaches during the highest high tide shall remain under the classification of
 forest or timberland.

SEC. 3. Subject to the vested rights of qualified occupants, the
disposition of the agricultural lands declared in Section 1 hereof shall be
governed by the provisions of Commonwealth Act No. 141 or the Public Land
Act, as amended.

SEC. 4. Within ninety (90) days after the effectivity of this Act, the
Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, in
consultation with the Department of Tourism and concerned sectors, shall issue
the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.
SEC. 5. All laws, decrees, orders, proclamations, rules and regulations
or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed,
amended and/or modified accordingly.

14 SEC. 6. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication 15 in the Official Gazette or in at least two, national newspapers of general 16 circulation.
