AN ACT PROHIBITING THE IMPOSITION OF DEATH PENALTY IN THE PHILIPPINES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled.

1	SECTION 1. The imposition of death, as a penalty, is hereby prohibited.
2	For this purpose, Articles 25, 40, 70, 71 and 74 of the Revised Penal Code are
3	repealed, amended or modified according insofar as they impose the penalty of
4	death. Should the death penalty be provided as the sole and mandatory penalty
5	in a special statute or in the Revised Penal Code, the penalty shall be life
6	imprisonment.
7	SEC. 2. Article 63 of the Revised Penal Code is hereby amended to
8	read as follows:
9	"Article 63. Rules for the Application of Indivisible
10	Penalties In all cases in which the law prescribes a single
11	indivisible penalty, it shall be applied by the courts regardless of
12	any mitigating or aggravating circumstances that may have
13	attended the commission of the deed,"
! 4	[In all cases in which the law prescribes a penalty composed
15	of two indivisible penalties, the following rules shall be observed in
16	the application thereof:
17	(1) When in the commission of the deed there is present
18	only one aggravating cucumstance, the greater penalty shall be
19	applied.

1	(2) When there are neither mitigating nor aggravating
2	circumstances in the commission of the deed, the lesser penalty
3	shall be applied.
4	(3) When the commission of the act is attended by some
5	mitigating circumstances and there is no aggravating
6	circumstances, the tesser penalty shall applied.
7	(4) When both miligating and aggravating circumstances
8	attended the commission of the act, the courts shall reasonably
9	allow them to offset one another in consideration of their number
10	and importance with the preceding rules, according to the result of
11	such compensation.
12	SEC. 3. Republic Act No. 7659, as amended by Republic Act No.
13	8177, and all other laws, inconsistent with this Act are likewise repealed or
14	amended accordingly.
15	SEC. 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
16	in two newspapers of national circulation,
