AN ACT TO PROHIBIT APPOINTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING THOSE OFFICIALS OF GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND -CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS (GOCCS) AND THEIR SUBSIDIARIES, FROM ENTERING, PLAYING AND PATRONIZING CASINOS AND OTHER SIMILAR ESTABLISHMENTS, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as the "Decency in
- 2 Public Service Act of 2006".
- 3 SEC. 2. Prohibition. All appointed public officials and employees,
- 4 including those who work in government-owned and -controlled corporations
- 5 (GOCCs) and their subsidiaries, regardless of rank, designation and status of
- 6 employment, are hereby prohibited from entering, playing and/or patronizing

- 1 casinos and other similar establishments whether operated by the Philippine
- 2 Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) or any private entity,
- 3 corporation or proprietorship: Provided, however, That an exemption to the
- 4 prohibition for entry to be given to appointed public officials and employees
- 5 who enter the casinos and similar establishments for entertainment purposes or
- 6 those conducting official and work-related functions such as, but not limited to,
- 7 the following:

- 8 (a) Police or security matters;
- 9 (b) Work-related activities for those who are officials and employees of 10 GOCCs;
- 11 (c) Conduct of investigation and query; and
 - (d) Other official functions that may be deemed necessary: *Provided,*That a written directive stating the purpose of such entry is issued by a competent authority: *Provided, further,* That an exemption to the prohibition on entry shall be afforded to appointed public officials and employees who enter the casino or other similar establishments during nonbusiness hours.
 - SEC. 3. Posting of Rules and Regulations. Within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, the Civil Service Commission (CSC) shall issue the necessary implementing rules and regulations for the effective implementation of the provisions of this Act.

The CSC shall ensure that copies of this Act shall be conspicuously posted at the main entrance of all casinos and/or other similar establishments.

The CSC shall further cause the dissemination of the rules and regulations to all branches, agencies, divisions, units and instrumentalities of government for effective information and monitoring.

SEC. 4. *Penalty.* – Any appointed public official and employee who is found liable for violating the provision of Section 2 hereof shall, upon conviction, be penalized by a fine ranging from One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) to Three hundred thousand pesos (P300,000.00) or an imprisonment ranging from six months to six years without probation, or both, at the discretion of the court. In addition, he shall suffer perpetual disqualification from holding public office.

Any official and employee in PAGCOR-operated establishments who shall knowingly allow an appointed public official and employee to play in the casino or any other similar gambling establishments shall, upon conviction, be penalized by a fine ranging from One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) to Three hundred thousand pesos (P300,000.00) or an imprisonment ranging from six months to six years without probation, or both, at the discretion of the court.

1	The Philippine National Police (PNP) and other law enforcement
2	agencies may enter and arrest appointed public officials and employees caught
3	violating this Act en flagrante delicto.

In addition to the criminal penalty, the appointed public officials and employees shall be administratively liable. The CSC shall institute the appropriate administrative action against violators of this Act in accordance with civil service rules and regulations.

- SEC. 5. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are contrary to or inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 6. Separability Clause. If any part or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.
 - SEC. 7. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from its publication in two national newspapers of general circulation after its approval by the President.
