AN ACT

STRENGTHENING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NATIONAL ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PROGRAM, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT 10068, OR THE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE ACT OF 2010

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 2 on Declaration of Policy is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC.2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote, propagate, develop further and implement the practice of organic FARMING AND OTHER SUSTAINABLE agriculture PRACTICES in the Philippines that will cumulatively condition and enrich the fertility of the soil, increase farm productivity AND FARMERS' INCOMES, reduce pollution and destruction of the environment, prevent the depletion of natural resources, further protect the health of farmers, consumers, and the general public, [and] save on imported farm inputs AND PROMOTE FOOD SELF SUFFICIENCY.

Towards this end, a comprehensive program for the promotion of communitybased organic agriculture systems, which include, among others, farmerproduced [purely organic fertilizers such as compost, pesticides] ORGANIC SOIL AMENDMENTS, BIO CONTROL AGENTS and other farm inputs, [together with a nationwide educational and promotional campaign for their use and processing, as well as adoption of organic agriculture system as a

2 C. CERTIFICATION. THE BAFS SHALL PROVIDE THE 3 GUIDELINES FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF FARMS, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT. A FARM OR 4 FARMOWNER APPLYING FOR CERTIFICATION AS AN 5 6 ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PRACTITIONER SHALL APPLY 7 WITHIN THE SAME MUNICIPALITY OR CITY. THE DECISION OF THE CORE PGS GROUP OR OF THE ORGANIC 8 9 CERTIFYING BODY ON SAID **APPLICATION** FOR CERTIFICATION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO APPEAL: PROVIDED, 10 THAT SUCH CERTIFICATION SHALL BE ISSUED IN THE 11 12 NAME OF THE CORE PGS GROUP OF WHICH THE FARM OR 13 FARMOWNER IS A MEMBER. FURTHER, WITHDRAWAL OF 14 MEMBERSHIP IN SAID CORE PGS GROUP SHALL RESULT IN THE FORFEITURE OF THE PRIVILEGE THE FARM OR 15 FARMOWNER TO USE THE CORE PGS GROUP CERTIFICATE: 16 17 **PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT ONLY MINIMAL FEES SHALL BE** 18 COLLECTED FOR THE APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION.

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D. OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION. THE BAFS SHALL PROVIDE THE 20 ACCREDITATION. 21 **GUIDELINES** FOR **OFFICIAL** A 22 REGISTERED CORE PGS GROUP SHALL APPLY FOR OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION WITH THE BAFS. A CORE PGS 23 **GROUP SHALL BE ACCORDED OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION** 24 25 BY THE BAFS ONLY IF IT HAS AT LEAST FIVE (5) MEMBERS, 26 WHO SHALL COME FROM DIFFERENT FARMS IN THE 27 MUNICIPALITY OR THAT ARE ACTUALLY CITY PRACTICING ORGANIC AGRICULTURE. 28

30THE BAFS SHALL ISSUE ITS DECISION ON THE31APPLICATION FOR OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION BY A CORE32PGS GROUP OR ANY QUALIFIED ENTITY APPLYING FOR33ACCREDITATION WITHIN SIXTY WORKING (60) DAYS FROM34THE SUBMISSION OF THE COMPLETE REQUIREMENTS, AND

FAILURE TO RENDER DECISION WITHIN SUCH PERIOD SHALL BE UNDERSTOOD AS AN APPROVAL OF THE APPLICATION FOR OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION OF THE PGS/OCB. THE BAFS SHALL NOT CHARGE ANY OFFICIAL ACCREDITATION OR APPLICATION FEES.

EVERY PGS GROUP SHOULD HAVE AT 10 LEAST FIVE (5) MEMBERS, COMPOSED OF FARMERS FROM A 11 COMBINATION OF BOTH THE CROPS AND LIVESTOCK SECTORS. IT MAY ADD TO ITS MEMBERSHIP FARMERS FROM 12 13 **OTHER SECTORS IN AGRICULTURE, NON-GOVERNMENT** 14 ORGANIZATIONS, PEOPLE'S ORGANIZATIONS, BUYERS OF 15 **ORGANIC AGRICULTURE PRODUCTS, SUPPLIERS OF ORGANIC** INPUTS, AMONG OTHERS, WHO LIVE IN THE SAME 16 17 MUNICIPALITY OR CITY, AND REGULARLY INTERACT WITH 18 EACH OTHER.

EACH CORE PGS GROUP WILL HAVE THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

THE MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS 20 21 GROUP SHALL BE COMPOSED OF THE FOLLOWING: 1) ONE (1) REPRESENTATIVE FOR EACH CORE PGS GROUP IN THE 22 MUNICIPALITY OR CITY, AND 2) ONE (1) REPRESENTATIVE 23 24 FROM A REGIONAL AGRICULTURAL STATE UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE (SUC) OR LOCAL PRIVATE AGRICULTURAL 25 EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION: PROVIDED, THAT, THERE 26 SHOULD BE AT LEAST TWO (2) CORE PGS GROUPS IN THE 27 MUNICIPALITY OR CITY BEFORE A MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS 28 29 **GROUP SHALL BE ESTABLISHED.** 30 THE MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS GROUP SHALL CONDUCT 31 ITS BUSINESS AND AFFAIRS BASED ON THE DECISION OF THE 32 33 MAJORITY OF MEMBERS PRESENT IN A MEETING, THERE

BEING A QUORUM.

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THE MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS GROUP SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING POWERS, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

AN ADVERSE 17 DECISION OF THE MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS 18 GROUP MAY BE BROUGHT TO THE BAFS ON 19 20 APPEAL. THE BAFS SHALL RULE ON THE APPEAL WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS FROM THE FILING 21 THEREOF. FAILURE TO RULE ON SUCH APPEAL 22 SHALL BE CONSIDERED AS A REVERSAL OF THE 23 **APPEALED DECISION.** 24
- THE INACTION OR INDECISION OF THE 26 iv. 27 MUNICIPAL OR CITY PGS GROUP ON AN APPEAL THE DECISION OF THE ORGANIC 28 FROM CERTIFYING BODY, AFTER FIFTEEN (15) DAYS 29 FROM THE FILING OF THE APPEAL, SHALL BE 30 **CONSIDERED THE UPHOLDING OF THE APPEALED** 31 DECISION. THE FARMER COMPLAINANT MAY 32 THEN HAVE THE OPTION TO FILE AN APPEAL 33 WITH THE BAFS. THE BAFS SHALL RULE ON THE 34

APPEAL WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS FROM THE FILING THEREOF. FAILURE TO RULE ON SUCH APPEAL SHALL BE CONSIDERED AS A REVERSAL OF THE APPEALED DECISION;

v. MAINTAIN A REGISTRY OF CORE PGS GROUPS OPERATING WITHIN ITS AREA OF JURISDICTION, WHICH SHALL BE FORWARDED TO THE BAFS AT THE END OF EACH YEAR AND ENTERED INTO THE LATTER'S NATIONAL DATABASE;

TOGETHER WITH THE ORGANIC CERTIFYING vi. IN THE INSPECTION BODY INVOLVED AND IN CERTIFICATION ACTIVITY, AND ISSUE WITH THE BAFS, COORDINATION PARTICIPATORY ORGANIC CERTIFICATE AND THE "PGS GUARANTEED ORGANIC" LABEL OR MARK TO COMPLIANT SMALL FARMERS AND FISHERFOLK AND THEIR FARMS, ASSOCIATIONS, **OR COOPERATIVE (FAC); AND**

> vii. SUBMIT REGULARLY TO THE BAFS A LIST OF CERTIFIED SMALL FARMERS, FISHERFOLK AND THEIR FARMS, ASSOCIATIONS AND COOPERATIVES (FAC).

IN THE MEANTIME THAT A CORE PGS GROUP OR A MUNICIPAL/CITY PGS, WHICHEVER IS THE CASE, HAS YET TO BE ESTABLISHED, THE BAFS, IN COORDINATION WITH THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CONCERNED, SHALL ASSIST SMALL UNIT FARMERS IN THE FORMATION OF THE **MUNICIPALITY/CITY PGS.**

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3. PROVINCIAL AND NATIONAL PGS GROUP. IT SHALL BE THE
 OPTION OF THE PGS GROUPS TO FORM AGGRUPATIONS AT
 THE PROVINCIAL AND NATIONAL LEVELS. THEY SHALL
 RECEIVE THE FINANCIAL AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE,

THE NOAB SHALL ENSURE THAT EACH PROVINCE IN 19 THE COUNTRY HAS A PGS. EVERY PGS SHALL CONDUCT 20 TRAININGS AND PROMOTE ORGANIC AGRICULTURE.

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22 G. TRAINING AND INSPECTION. THE AGRICULTURE TRAINING 23 INSTITUTE (ATI) SHALL CONDUCT TRAININGS FOR PGS 24 GROUPS AND THE BAFS SHALL CONDUCT RANDOM 25 INSPECTIONS TO ENSURE THAT PGS GROUPS ARE ALL 26 COMPLIANT WITH THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL STANDARDS ON 27 ORGANIC AGRICULTURE. 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H. *INCENTIVES*. ANY SMALL FARMER, FISHERFOLK OR THEIR
