AN ACT

DECLARING THE AGUSAN MARSH LOCATED IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF TALACOGON, SAN FRANCISCO, ROSARIO, BUNAWAN, LORETO, LA PAZ AND VERUELA, ALL IN THE PROVINCE OF AGUSAN DEL SUR, AN ECOTOURISM ZONE, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. - The State is mandated to promote a tourism
 industry that is ecologically sustainable, responsible, participative, culturally sensitive,
 economically viable, and equitably beneficial to local communities.

Sec. 2. Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone. - The Agusan Marsh located in the
Municipalities of Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Loreto, La Paz and Veruela,
in the Province of Agusan del Sur is hereby declared an ecotourism zone.

- Sec. 3. Scope and Coverage. This Act shall cover the Municipalities of Talacogon,
 San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan, Loreto, La Paz and Veruela.
 The setting of the technical boundaries of the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone shall
- 10 be undertaken by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) and other

1 concerned agencies.

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Sec. 4. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act:

3 a. Biodiversity conservation refers to the practice of preserving the variety of species, habits and ecosystems, and genetic diversity of the place, including *inter* alia, terrestrial, marine and other aquatic ecosystems, and the ecological complexes which they are a part of;

- 7 b. Community-based tourism refers to a form of tourism where the local community 8 and its residents have substantial control over and involvement in the development 9 and management of the local tourism industry and a greater portion of the 10 economic gains remain within the community;
- 11 c. Ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism within a natural area where 12 community participation, protection and management of natural resources, 13 cultural and indigenous knowledge and practices, environmental education and 14 ethics, as well as economic benefits are fostered and pursued for the enrichment of host communities and satisfaction of visitors; 15
- 16 d. Homestay refers to a mode of tourist accommodation where a tourist stays in a 17 private home and experiences the day-to-day life of the local residents; and
- 18 e. Responsible ecotourism refers to a form of sustainable tourism in which both the 19 tourism sector and the tourists take responsibility in the protection and 20 conservation of the natural environment and the local culture and ways of life, and 21 where community participation in ecotourism as well as the economic benefits 22 that may be derived therefrom are fostered and pursued for the enjoyment and 23 well-being of local residents and visitors alike.

24 Sec. 5. Development Strategies. - To accomplish the development of the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone, the State shall: 25

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- 1a. Develop and promote responsible community-based ecological tourism as the core2management strategy in the development of the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone;
- b. Ensure the conservation of the biodiversity and the preservation of said
 ecotourism zone;
- 5 c. Develop ecotourism products and programs that will generate employment and 6 livelihood for the local residents concerned consistent with the preservation and 7 conservation of natural resources;
- 8 d. Guarantee that the financial and economic benefits of the tourism industry are 9 equitably shared by and distributed among the local residents concerned, by 10 giving preference and support to community- and home-based micro and small 11 tourism enterprises such as homestays, restaurants, food and fruit stands, and other 12 similar tourism-oriented businesses and activities;
- e. Ensure that the quality of local tourism programs and activities are educational
 and enriching for tourists and visitors through the provision of orientation,
 educational and tour programs by local tour operators, non-government
 organizations (NGOs), concerned local government units (LGUs), DENR and the
 Department of Tourism (DOT); and
- f. Guarantee that in the development and promotion of the local tourism industry,
 the concerned LGUs shall ensure the adequate provision of water supply, food,
 energy and transportation for the needs of the local residents and communities.

Sec. 6. The Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Development and Management Plan. – Within one hundred and twenty (120) days after the approval of this Act, the DOT, in coordination with the DENR, shall formulate the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Development and Management Plan that shall be complemented by a set of guidelines for a responsible, community-based tourism.

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	1	The Ecotourism Development and Management Plan shall ensure the preservation of

	3	a. Carrying capacity of the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone, including its endemic and

	5	b. Specific site assessment;	•
	6	c. Identification of strategic priorities;	
	7	d. Product development plans for local income generation;	4, 9
	8 .	e. Capacity-building for the local community so residents therein can ably manage	
	9	economically viable and responsible, community- based ecotourism business	
	10	enterprises;	4
	11	f. Strategies to promote the formulation of local production groups and networks,	
	12	including the marketing and pricing of products; and	
	13	g. Marketing strategies that uphold the natural, social and environmental integrity of	
	14	the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Zone and its local residents.	
	15	The process of formulating the Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Development and	•
	16	Management Plan shall be participatory, with the framework to be provided by the DOT and	
	17	the DENR, in consultation with the municipal governments of Talacogon, San Francisco,	
	18	Rosario, Bunawan, Loreto, La Paz and Veruela.	
	19	Sec. 7. Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Board. – The Agusan Marsh Ecotourism Board,	
•	20	hereinafter referred to as the Board, is hereby created. It shall be composed of the following:	
	21	a. Governor of the Province of Agusan del Sur, as Chairperson;	
	22	b. Secretary of the DOT, or a duly authorized representative;	
	23	c. Secretary of the DENR, or a duly authorized representative;	
	24	d. Mayors of the Municipalities of Talacogon, San Francisco, Rosario, Bunawan,	
	25	Loreto, La Paz and Veruela;	•
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1	e. Representative from a non-government organization whose advocacy is			
2	environmental preservation;			
3	f. Representative from the academe;			
· 4	g. Representative from the business sector; and			
5	h. Representative from the private sector.			
6	The Board shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the proper			
7	implementation of this Act by the concerned LGUs, and shall, as the need arises, amend,			
8	modify or revise such rules and regulations to meet the needs of changing times			
9	Sec. 8. Appropriations The Secretaries of the DOT and DENR shall include in			
10	their respective Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which			
11	shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act, and shall augment such allocation			
12	with internally generated funds of the DOT.			
13	Sec. 9. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act shall be declared			
14	unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force			
15	and effect.			
16	Sec. 10. Repealing Clause All laws, rules, regulations, executive orders, presidential			
17	decrees and other issuances inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby			
18	deemed repealed or amended accordingly.			
19	Sec. 11. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication			
20	in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
