AN ACT

DEVELOPING THE TIKOG INDUSTRY, CREATING FOR THE PURPOSE THE TIKOG RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTER, ESTABLISHING THE BANIG SUBSIDY FUND, AND DECLARING THE MUNICIPALITY OF BASEY IN THE PROVINCE OF SAMAR AS THE "BANIG CAPITAL OF THE PHILIPPINES"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Republic of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the Tikog Industry Development Act. 1 2 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is the policy of the State to instill nationalism among the 3 citizenry. In pursuit thereof, the State shall promote the preferential use of locally manufactured 4 goods which utilize local resources and generate wider employment. It shall adopt measures that 5 6 will make local industries competitive. It is likewise the policy of the State to promote and accelerate the development and growth 7 of the Province of Samar according to sound policies that seek to uplift the economic, and social 8 conditions of the people, as well as preserve local culture, heritage and traditions. 9 SEC. 3. Creation of the Tikog Research and Development Center. - Within one (1) year 10 from the approval of this Act, there shall be established a Tikog Research and Development Center 11 in the Province of Samar which shall be attached to the Samar State University in Catbalogan City. 12 SEC. 4. Functions of the Tikog Research and Development Center. - The Tikog Research 13 and Development Center shall exercise the following powers and functions: 14

 a) Undertake and conduct researches and technical studies on the development, production, management, and marketing of *tikog* and *banig* products;

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- b) Publish research studies, papers, articles, and other works or writings relating to tikog and
 banig-weaving with the end goal of benefitting farmers, weavers, traders, and other
 stakeholders;
- c) Train faculty members and other research personnel who will undertake research studies
 on tikog and the banig-weaving traditions of the area in order to document and preserve
 them, and to create the body of knowledge necessary in the formulation of education and
 training programs designed to encourage the development of a creative mass of local
 artisans, and the pursuit of entrepreneurial activities that showcase locally-woven products;
 Formulate a Tikog and Banig-weaving Development Roadmap;
- e) Develop innovations in tikog propagation and banig production and development as well
 as provide for the transfer and improvement of appropriate technologies and techniques;
- f) Provide technical support and assistance for sustainable tikog propagation and banig
 production and other development activities to promote and provide adequate training to
 farmers and individuals and other stakeholders engaged in tikog propagation, and banig
 production, processing, and distribution in the Province of Samar;
- g) Develop and provide marketing and intellectual property protection, education and training
 programs for tikog farmers and banig product makers and entrepreneurs;
- h) Establish standards in grading, sampling and inspection, tests and analysis, specifications,
 packaging, preservation, conservation and transportation of tikog and banig products;
- i) Coordinate with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) and other concerned
 government agencies for the participation of tikog farmers, banig weavers, traders and
 exporters in local and international conferences, trade fairs, expositions and exhibits;
- j) Coordinate with the Department of Education (DepEd) and other concerned government
 agencies in developing and including a Banig-weaving course in the curriculum of select
 senior high schools in the Province of Samar;
- k) Coordinate with the local government units as well as concerned government agencies and
 offices to consolidate all policies, programs and projects relating to tikog and banig weaving research and development; and

 Perform such other functions and duties necessary or incidental to the promotion and development of the Tikog and Banig-weaving Industry and in the accomplishment of the objectives of this Act.

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SEC. 5. Banig Subsidy Fund. - A Banig-weaving Subsidy Fund shall be established to
financially support and provide capital development to banig production, weaving, trading, skills
training and other related activities.

SEC. 6. Banig Capital of the Philippines. - To help promote the abovementioned public
policy and further develop the local banig-weaving industry, the Municipality of Basey in the
Province of Samar is hereby declared as the Banig Capital of the Philippines.

10 SEC. 7. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. – Within sixty (60) days from effectivity of 11 this Act, the Department of Agriculture and Department of Environment and Natural Resources 12 shall, in collaboration with the Department of Trade and Industry, Department of Science and 13 Technology, and Samar State University formulate and prescribe the necessary implementing rules 14 and regulations to carry out the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 8. Appropriations. – The amount necessary for the immediate implementation of this
 Act shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 9. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the
 remainder of this Act or any provision not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 10. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, presidential decrees or issuances, executive orders,
 letters of instruction, administrative orders, rules or regulation inconsistent with the provisions of
 this Act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 11. *Effectivity*. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the
 Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
