GRANTING ADDITIONAL PRIVILEGES TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7277, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article XIII Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution states that, "The State shall adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development which shall endeavor to make essential goods, health and other social services available to all people at affordable cost. There shall be priority for the needs of the underprivileged sick, elderly, disabled, women and children. $\times \times \times$."

Several laws were already enacted to address the concerns of persons with disability (PWD). Republic Act (RA) No. 7277, or the "Magna Carta for Disabled Persons" was signed on 24 March 1992. Subsequently, RA 9442 (Expanding the Benefits and Privileges of PWDs), RA 10070 (Establishing Institutional Mechanism to Ensure the Implementation of Programs and Services for PWDs), RA 10524 (Expanding the Positions Reserved for PWDs), RA 10754 (Expanding the Benefits and Privileges of PWDs), and RA 11228 (Mandatory PhilHealth Coverage for PWDs) were enacted.

The number of PWDs among our populace has increased in recent years. According to the records of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), "of the 92.1 million household population in the country, 1,443 thousand persons or 1.57 percent had disability, based on the 2010 Census of Population and Housing (2010 CPH). The recorded figure of PWDs in the 2000 CPH was 935,551 persons, which was 1.23

percent of the household population." Further, PSA reported on 03 May 2019 that, "results of the National Disability Prevalence Survey (NDPS) showed that, in 2016, around 12 percent of Filipinos age 15 and older experienced severe disability. Almost one in every two (47%) experienced moderate disability while 23 percent with mild disability. Almost one-fifth (19%) experience no disability."

In the continuing endeavor of the government to improve the welfare of the PWDs, this measure seeks to enhance the benefits of the PWDs as follows:

- Increase the proportion of employment of PWDs, both in the government agencies and private sector;
- Provide incentives to employers who hire PWDs as regular employees;
- Provide P500.00 monthly stipend to PWDs;
- Provide free assistive technology services in the workplace;
- Provide free assistive devices and technologies to PWDs;
- Exempt PWDs from passport processing fee and other fees;

The urgent passage of this bill is highly recommended.



GRANTING ADDITIONAL PRIVILEGES TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7277, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE MAGNA CARTA FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 4 of Chapter 1, Title One of Republic Act No. 7277, as 1 amended, otherwise known as the "Magna Carta for Persons with Disabilities" is 2 hereby amended by inserting new subsections to read as follows: 3 "Sec. 4. Definition of Terms. - [For purposes of] AS 4 **USED IN** this Act[, these terms are defined as follows]: 5 $X \times X''$ 6 "(Q) ASSISTIVE DEVICES AND TECHNOLOGIES 7 TO WHEELCHAIRS AND WALKERS, 8 PROSTHESES, HEARING AIDS, AIDS FOR THE 9 VISUALLY IMPAIRED, AND SPECIALIZED COMPUTER 10 SOFTWARE, HARDWARE AND PERIPHERALS THAT 11 MOBILITY, HEARING, VISION, 12 INCREASE COMMUNICATION CAPACITIES, AMONG OTHERS, 13 THEIR PRIMARY PURPOSE IS TO MAINTAIN OR 14 IMPROVE AN INDIVIDUAL'S FUNCTIONING AND 15 INDEPENDENCE TO FACILITATE PARTICIPATION AND 16

A qualified [disabled] 13 employee **WITH DISABILITY** shall be subject to the same 14 terms and conditions of employment and the same 15 compensation, privileges, benefits, fringe benefits, incentives 16 or allowances as a qualified able-bodied person. 17 [Five] AT LEAST TWO percent [(5%)] (2%) of all [casual, 18 emergency and contractual positions in the Department of 19 Social Welfare and Development; Health; Education, Culture 20 and Sports; and other government agencies, offices or 21 corporations engaged in social development shall be reserved 22 for disabled persons POSITIONS IN ALL GOVERNMENT 23 AGENCIES, OFFICES OR CORPORATIONS SHALL BE 24 FILLED UP WITH QUALIFIED PERSONS WITH 25 26 **DISABILITIES:** PROVIDED, THAT PRIVATE CORPORATIONS ARE MANDATED TO RESERVE AT 27 **LEAST ONE PERCENT (1%) OF ALL POSITIONS FOR** 28 29 PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES: PROVIDED, FURTHER,

Sec. 3. Section 8 (a) and (b) of Chapter 1, Title Two of Republic Act No. 7277, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 8. Incentives for Employers. – (a) To encourage the active participation of the private sector in promoting the [welfare] RIGHTS of [disabled] persons WITH **DISABILITIES** and to ensure gainful employment for qualified [disabled] persons WITH DISABILITIES, adequate incentives shall be provided to private entities which employ [disabled] persons WITH DISABILITIES.

"(b) Private entities that employ [disabled] persons **WITH DISABILITIES** who meet the required skills or qualifications, [either as regular employee,] **AS** apprentice or learner, shall be entitled to an additional deduction, from their gross income, equivalent to twenty-five percent (25%) of the total amount paid as salaries and wages to [disabled] persons WITH DISABILITIES, WHILE PRIVATE ENTITIES THAT **EMPLOY SAID PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AS** REGULAR EMPLOYEES SHALL BE ENTITLED TO AN ADDITIONAL DEDUCTION, FROM THEIR GROSS INCOME, EQUIVALENT TO FIFTY PERCENT (50%) OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT PAID AS SALARIES AND WAGES TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES: Provided, [however, That such entities present proof as certified by the Department of Labor and Employment that disabled persons are under their employ: Provided, further, That the disabled employee is accredited with the Department of Labor and Employment and the Department of Health as to his disability, skills and qualifications.] THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT (DOLE), UNDER ITS LABOR LAWS, SHALL ISSUE A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE

TO PRIVATE **ENTITIES** AS **PRESCRIBED** IN DEPARTMENT ORDER NO. 131-B, SERIES OF 2016, ON THE REVISED RULES ON LABOR LAWS COMPLIANCE SYSTEM: PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT IF THERE IS NO **OUALIFIED PERSON WITH DISABILITY APPLICANT** AFTER THIRTY (30) DAYS FROM THE MANDATORY PUBLICATION BY THE EMPLOYER OF ITS JOB **VACANCY** RESERVED FOR **PERSONS** WITH **DISABILITIES, THE EMPLOYER MAY HIRE A NON-PWD** APPLICANT FOR SAID RESERVED POSITIONS BY SECURING PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE DOLE.

Sec. 4. Section 32 of Chapter 8, Title Two of Republic Act No. 7277, as amended, is hereby amended by inserting two new subsections to read as follows:

"Sec. 32. Persons with disability shall be entitled to the following:

"X X X

"(L) A MONTHLY STIPEND AMOUNTING TO FIVE **HUNDRED PESOS (P500.00) TO AUGMENT THE DAILY** SUBSISTENCE, MEDICAL AND OTHER NEEDS OF MARGINALIZED PERSONS WITH **DISABILITIES: PROVIDED, THAT PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES WHO** ARE **RECIPIENTS** OF SIMILAR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE GOVERNMENT, INCLUDING MONETARY ASSISTANCE FOR SENIOR CITIZENS AND BENEFICIARIES UNDER THE PANTAWID PAMILYANG PILIPINO PROGRAM, OR 4PS, SHALL NO LONGER BE **GIVEN THIS STIPEND;**

"(M) PROVISION OF FREE ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES SUCH AS THE EVALUATION OF THE NEEDS AND THE FUNCTIONAL CAPACITY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES IN THE CUSTOMARY ENVIRONMENT OR PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT, AS WELL AS SELECTING, DESIGNING, FITTING, CUSTOMIZING, ADAPTING, APPLYING, MAINTAINING, REPAIRING, REPLACING ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY **DEVICES**; TRAINING OR TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES; SIGN LANGUAGE INTERPRETING AND JOB COACHING, AND SUCH OTHER FORMS OF ASSISTANCE: PROVIDED, THAT THE BENEFICIARY IS A MARGINALIZED PERSON WITH DISABILITY AS CERTIFIED BY THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICE OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT **CONCERNED**; "(N) PROVISION OF FREE ASSISTIVE DEVICES AND

TECHNOLOGIES INCLUDING TECHNICAL AIDS, PROSTHETIC AND ORTHOTIC **DEVICES** OR APPLIANCES PARTICULARLY FOR PERSONAL USE OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES THAT WILL RESTORE THEIR SOCIAL FUNCTIONING AND PARTICIPATION IN ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES AND COMMUNITY DEVICES AFFAIRS, AND SUCH OTHER AND TECHNOLOGIES APPROPRIATE TO OTHER DISABILITIES: PROVIDED, THAT THE BENEFICIARY IS A MARGINALIZED PERSON WITH DISABILITY AS CERTIFIED BY THE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICE OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNIT CONCERNED;

"(O) EXEMPTION FROM PASSPORT PROCESSING FEES, AS WELL AS TRAVEL TAXES, TERMINAL FEES, OTHER FEES AND CHARGES LEVIED IN AIRPORTS, PORTS, OR OTHER TERMINALS BY THE GOVERNMENT, ITS AGENCIES OR INSTRUMENTALITIES, OR BY GOVERNMENT-OWNED AND CONTROLLED CORPORATIONS.

Sec. 5. *Appropriations.* – The Secretary of Social Welfare and Development shall include in the DSWD's programs the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be included in the Annual General Appropriations Act.

- Sec. 6. *Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR).* The DSWD, in coordination with the NCDA and, in consultation with the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), the Department of Health (DOH), the DOLE, the Department of Finance (DOF), and the Civil Service Commission (CSC), shall promulgate, not later than ninety (90) days after the effectivity of this Act, the necessary rules and regulations for its proper and effective implementation.
- Sec. 7. *Separability Clause*. If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provisions hereof.
- Sec. 8. *Repealing Clause.* All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders and rules and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- Sec. 9. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines.
