RESTRUCTURING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 25, 26, 29, 30, 31, 35, 36, AND 67 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6975, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT OF 1990", AS AMENDED, AND SECTION 32 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8551, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE REFORM AND REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1998", AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The 1987 Constitution, Article XVI Section 6 thereof specifically provides that:

The State shall establish and maintain one police force, which shall be national in scope and civilian in character, to be administered and controlled by a national police commission.

The Philippine National Police (PNP) data shows that from July 2022 to January 7, 2023, it recorded 105,568 crime incidents in the country. In connection with this, in the past few months we were shocked by news about the strings of killings of politicians all over the country. The latest assassination of Negros Oriental Governor Roel Degamo last week depicted the culture of impunity and violence in the country recently. It is disturbing to know that these ambush and attacks were done with brutality and ruthlessness to people in government positions.

Needless to say, crime prevention and policing has been more complicated and challenging with the growing population, new levels of criminality and violence and advancement in technology. The duty of our PNP to secure the rule of law, maintain public order and security, prevent, detect and investigate crimes has become intricate and perplexed as the years go by. It is without doubt that it is high time to push for much-need organizational reform and restructure of our countries national police.

It is in this way, that this measure proposes to amend Republic Act No. 6975 and Republic Act 8551 in order to have a clearer mandate in the discharge of duties of the following groups: National Operational Support Units which now includes the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, Civil Security Group, PNP Anti-Cybercrime Group, Maritime Group, Highway Patrol Group, PNP Forensic Group, Anti-Kidnapping Group, Explosives and Ordinance and Canine Group, and Women and Children Protection Group, among others.

To further enhance police operational efficiency and effectiveness, the Chief PNP may constitute, modify, or merge PNP units and offices as may be necessary to implement adjustments in the organizational structure, staffing, functions, and functional relationships subject to the approval of the Commission. Lastly, this bill proposes to include and consider police cadets as members of the PNP and shall be entitled to the salaries and benefits of an active police personnel.

In view of the foregoing, the swift passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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NINETEENTH CONGRESS OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES) First Regular Session

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines, in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 25 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25. Organization. – [The PNP shall be headed by a Chief who shall be assisted by two (2) deputy chief, one (1) for operations and one (1) for administration, both of whom shall be appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Commission from among the most senior and qualified officers in the service: Provided, however, That in no case shall any officer who has retired or is retirable within six (6) months from his compulsory retirement age be appointed as Chief of the PNP. The PNP shall be composed of a national office, AREA COMMANDS, regional offices, provincial offices, district offices, **CITY OFFICES**, and city or municipal stations.

At the national level, the [PNP-shall maintain its office in Metropolitan Manila which] CHIEF OF THE PNP SHALL HAVE A COMMAND GROUP COMPOSED OF THE OFFICES OF THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR ADMINISTRATION, THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR OPERATIONS, AND THE CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF. THE NATIONAL OFFICE shall [house the] HAVE A directorial staff, [service staff]

NATIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATIONAL SUPPORT UNITS, and special [support units] POLICE OFFICES.

IN CLUSTERED POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES, THE PNP SHALL HAVE AREA POLICE COMMANDS.

At the regional level, the PNP shall have **POLICE** regional offices, including that of the National Capital Region **POLICE OFFICE**, which may be divided into two (2) separate regions, without prejudice to the pertinent provisions of the Organic Act for the Autonomous Regions of the Cordilleras and Muslim Mindanao relative to the creation of a [regional] [p]Police **REGIONAL** [force] **OFFICE** in the area of autonomy. [Each of these regional offices] **POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES** shall be headed by [a regional director] [for peace and order] **REGIONAL DIRECTORS**.

AT THE METROPOLITAN LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A DISTRICT OFFICE, EACH HEADED BY A DISTRICT DIRECTOR.

At the provincial level, there shall be a [PNP] POLICE PROVINCIAL office, each headed by a [p]Provincial [d] Director. In the case of large provinces, police districts may be established by the Commission to be headed by a [d]District [d]Director.

AT THE HIGHLY URBANIZED AND INDEPENDENT COMPONENT CITY LEVEL, THERE SHALL BE A CITY POLICE OFFICE, EACH HEADED BY A CITY DIRECTOR.

At the **COMPONENT** city or municipal level, there shall be a **[PNP] POLICE** station, each headed by a chief of police.

The Chief of the PNP shall, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act and in accordance with the broad guidelines set forth herein, recommend the organizational structure and staffing pattern of the PNP to the Commission.

Section 2. A new Section 25-A is hereby inserted in Republic Act No. 6975, to read as follows:

"SEC. 25-A. PNP DIRECTORIAL STAFF. - THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF SYSTEM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED TO ENHANCE THE SPAN OF CONTROL BEING EXERCISED BY THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE ADMINISTRATION, OPERATION, AND CONTROL OF THE PNP AND TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE WORKING RELATIONSHIP OF ALL PNP OFFICES: PROVIDED, THAT THE CHIEF OF THE PNP MAY CONSTITUTE MODIFY, OR MERGE SUCH OTHER DIRECTORIAL STAFF AS MAY BE NECESSARY SUBJECT

TO THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSION: PROVIDED FURTHER, THAT NO DIRECTORIAL STAFF HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL OR HIGHER CAN BE CREATED UNLESS PROVIDED FOR BY LAW. THE FOLLOWING DIRECTORATES SHALL CONTINUE TO PERFORM THEIR SPECIFIC FUNCTIONS UNDER THE SUPERVISION AND AUTHORITY OF THE CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF:

CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF:

- (A) THE DIRECTORATE FOR PERSONNEL AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE MANAGEMENT OF PNP UNIFORMED AND NON-UNIFORMED PERSONNEL, MANPOWER PROCUREMENT AND CONTROL, PERSONNEL RECORDS AND REPORTS, DISCIPLINE, MORALE AND WELFARE, LAW AND ORDER, PERSONNEL SERVICES AND PERSONNEL PROCEDURES, AND MISCELLANEOUS FUNCTIONS ASSIGNED BY THE CHIEF OF THE PNP;
- (B) THE DIRECTORATE FOR INTELLIGENCE SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN ATTAINING INTELLIGENCE OBJECTIVES THROUGH EFFECTIVE MANAGEMENT OF ALL INTELLIGENCE AND COUNTERINTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES OF THE PNP;
- (C) THE DIRECTORATE FOR OPERATIONS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE EXERCISE OF THE COMMAND, CONTROL, DIRECTION, COORDINATION, AND SUPERVISION OF ALL ACTIVITIES CONCERNING OPERATIONS, EMPLOYMENT, AND DEPLOYMENT OF THE PNP;
- (D) THE DIRECTORATE FOR LOGISTICS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF LOGISTICS AND ITS FUNCTIONAL AREAS;
- (E) THE DIRECTORATE FOR PLANS SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP IN THE AREAS OF PLANS AND PROGRAMS THAT ARE BEYOND THE IMMEDIATE OPERATIONAL AND TACTICAL RANGE. THIS INCLUDES ORGANIZATIONAL AND FORCE DEVELOPMENT, SPECIAL STUDIES, RESEARCH AND PROJECT MANAGEMENT OF INTER-AGENCY AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS, LEGISLATIVE AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS THAT ARE NEEDED FOR THE EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION AND OPERATION OF THE PNP;
- (F) THE DIRECTORATE FOR COMPTROLLERSHIP SHALL ASSIST AND ADVISE THE CHIEF OF THE PNP ON BUDGETING,

IT SHALL PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN RELIABLE, SECURED, INTEGRATED, AND COST-EFFICIENT 46

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SERVICES AND FACILITIES TO ALL PNP OFFICES AND UNITS. IT

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LIKEWISE BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 1 SHALL IMPLEMENTATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DATABASE 2 3 SYSTEM OF THE ORGANIZATION AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF 4 **ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAPABILITIES** OF 5 THE PNP TO ADDRESS THE GROWING INCIDENCE CYBERCRIME IN THE COUNTRY." 6 7 8 **Section 3.** A new Section 25-B is hereby inserted in Republic Act No. 6975 to 9 read as follows: "SEC. 25-B. AREA POLICE COMMANDS (APC). - IN ORDER TO 10 ENHANCE THE CONTROL OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP, AREA POLICE 11 12 COMMANDS SHALL BE ESTABLISHED IN CLUSTERED POLICE REGIONAL OFFICES. THE APC SHALL ORCHESTRATE, SUPERVISE, 13 AND CONTROL THE CONDUCT OF INTER-REGIONAL OPERATIONS 14 AGAINST INSURGENCY, TERRORISM, AND OTHER INTERNAL 15 SECURITY THREATS. FINALLY, THE APC SHALL SUPPORT THE POLICE 20 REGIONAL OFFICES IN THE CONDUCT OF INTER-REGIONAL 21 **ANTI-CRIMINALITY OPERATIONS** AND INVESTIGATION. 22 FOR THIS PURPOSE, THE APCs SHALL HAVE ADMINISTRATIVE 23 AND OPERATIONAL CONTROL OVER THE EXISTING REGIONAL 24 MOBILE FORCE BATTALION WITHIN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS OF 25 RESPONSIBILITY SUBJECT TO THE EXERCISE OF THE POWER OF 26 DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP AND STRICT 27 COMPLIANCE TO THE DOCTRINE OF CHAIN OF COMMAND. 28 **INITIALLY, FIVE APCs SHALL BE ACTIVATED NAMELY:** 29 30 (A) NORTHERN LUZON AREA POLICE COMMAND; 31 32 33 (B) SOUTHERN LUZON AREA POLICE COMMAND; 34 35 (C) VISAYAS AREA POLICE COMMAND; 36 (D) EASTERN MINDANAO AREA POLICE COMMAND; AND 37 38 39 (E) WESTERN MINDANAO AREA POLICE COMMAND. 40

TO ENHANCE **OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS, THE CHIEF OF THE** PNP MAY CONSTITUTE, MODIFY, OR MERGE SPECIAL POLICE THE THE COMMISSION: PROVIDED, THAT NO SPECIAL POLICE OFFICE HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL OR HIGHER CAN BE CREATED UNLESS PROVIDED FOR BY LAW:
 - (A) CENTER FOR POLICE STRATEGY MANAGEMENT HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL SERVE ORGANIZATION ALL **STRATEGY** MANAGEMENT PROCESSES, SUSTAINING ITS STRATEGY EXECUTION AND MANAGEMENT, AND INSTILLING IN THE ORGANIZATION A CULTURE OF STRATEGIC FOCUS.
 - (B) HUMAN RIGHTS AFFAIRS OFFICE HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL SERVE AS A MANAGEMENT FACILITY THAT WILL OVERSEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PNP GUIDELINES AND POLICIES ON **HUMAN RIGHTS LAWS.**
 - (C) PEACE PROCESS AND DEVELOPMENT CENTER HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL BE THE OFFICE PRIMARILY RESPONSIBLE IN THE MONITORING OF THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF AGREEMENTS AND PERTINENT LAWS.
 - (D) COMMAND CENTER HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL BE THE MAIN MONITORING THE PNP OF ALL EVENTS AFFECTING **FACILITY OF** THE PEACE AND ORDER SITUATION NATIONWIDE. IT SHALL SERVE AS THE MAIN COORDINATING CENTER FOR ALL **OPERATING AND SUPPORT UNITS IN PURSUANCE OF PNP LAW** ENFORCEMENT, INTERNAL SECURITY, **SPECIAL** RECORDS/STATISTICS COMPILATION **OPERATIONS, AND FUNCTIONS.**

(E) PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICE — HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL SUPERVISE, EVALUATE, AND MONITOR THE PROVISION OF RELEVANT INFORMATION ON ONGOING PNP PROGRAMS, PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES TO ENHANCE THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC AND ULTIMATELY GAIN COMMUNITY SUPPORT AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION.

- (F) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL SERVE AS AN EXTENSION OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP TO ASSIST THE PRESIDENT AND THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY ON THE DIFFERENT ASPECTS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND ACT AS THE MAIN FOCAL POINT OF COORDINATION BETWEEN THE PNP AND THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT.
- (G) LIAISON OFFICE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE OFFICE SHALL ASSIST THE SECRETARY IN HIS CAPACITY AS THE EX-OFFICIO CHAIRPERSON OF THE COMMISSION.
- (H) LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS CENTER HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CENTER SHALL ACT AS THE PERMANENT PNP REPRESENTATIVE DURING CONGRESSIONAL HEARINGS AND DELIBERATIONS AS WELL AS UNDERTAKE NECESSARY ACTIONS TO PURSUE THE PASSAGE OF PNP PRIORITY BILLS AND RELATED BILLS IN THE CONGRESS OF THE PHILIPPINES."

Section 5. Section 26 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 26. Powers, Functions and Term of Office of the PNP Chief. – THE COMMAND AND DIRECTION OF THE PNP SHALL BE VESTED IN THE CHIEF OF THE PNP WHO SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO SELECT THE MEMBERS OF HIS COMMAND GROUP FROM AMONG THE QUALIFIED OFFICERS IN THE SERVICE. PROVIDED THAT THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR ADMINISTRATION AND THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR OPERATIONS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT UPON RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSION.

The [command and direction of the PNP shall be vested in the] Chief of the PNP [who] shall have the power to direct and control tactical as well as strategic movements, deployment, placement, utilization of the PNP or any of its units and personnel, including its equipment, facilities and other resources. Such command and direction of the Chief of the PNP may be delegated to

subordinate officials with respect to the units under their respective commands, in accordance with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission. The Chief of the PNP shall also have the power to issue detailed implementing policies and instructions—regarding personnel, funds, properties, records, correspondence and such other matters as may be necessary to effectively carry out the functions, powers and duties of the Bureau. The Chief of the PNP shall be appointed by the President from among the senior officers down to the rank of Police Brigadier General [, subject to confirmation by the Commission on Appointments]: Provided, That the Chief of the PNP shall serve a term of office not to exceed four (4) years[+] AND SHALL BE COMPULSORILY RETIRED AT THE MAXIMUM TENURE IN POSITION HEREIN PRESCRIBED, OR AT AGE FIFTY-SIX (56), WHICHEVER IS EARLIER: Provided, further, that in times of war or other national emergency declared by Congress, the President may extend such term of office."

TO ENHANCE POLICE OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS, THE CHIEF OF THE PNP MAY CONSTITUTE, MODIFY, OR MERGE PNP UNITS AND OFFICES AS MAY BE NECESSARY INCLUDING THE CORRESPONDING CHANGES IN THE NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF RANKS, OR OTHERWISE IMPLEMENT NECESSARY ADJUSTMENTS IN THE ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, STAFFING, FUNCTIONS, AND FUNCTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSION: PROVIDED, THAT NO PNP UNITS AND OFFICES HEADED BY A POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL OR HIGHER CAN BE CREATED UNLESS PROVIDED FOR BY LAW."

Section 6. Section 29 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 29. Key Positions. – The head of the PNP **SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF CHIEF OF THE PNP**, with the rank of Police General. [shall have the position title of the Chief of the PNP.] The second in command of the **PNP SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR ADMINISTRATION**, with the rank of Police Lieutenant General. [shall be the Deputy Chief of the PNP for Administration.] The third in command **SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF DEPUTY CHIEF OF THE PNP FOR OPERATIONS**, with the rank also of Police Lieutenant General. [shall be the Deputy Chief of the PNP for Operations.]

At the national office, the head of the directorial staff **SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF THE CHIEF OF THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF**, with the rank of Police Lieutenant General [shall be known as the Chief of the Directorial Staff of the PNP] **AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A SECRETARY TO THE DIRECTORIAL STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL.**

The heads of the various [staff divisions in the] directorial staff shall have THE POSITION TITLE OF DIRECTOR OF THEIR RESPECTIVE DIRECTORIAL STAFF, WITH the rank of Police Major General. [director with

the position title of Director of the Directorial Staff] THEY SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND EXECUTIVE OFFICER, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL. [of their respective functional divisions. The head of the Inspectorate Division with the rank of chief superintendent shall assume the position title of Inspector General] The heads of the NATIONAL administrative and operational support [divisions] UNITS shall have the rank of Police Brigadier General OR HIGHER.

THE HEADS OF AREA POLICE COMMANDS SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF COMMANDER, WITH THE RANK OF POLICE LIEUTENANT GENERAL AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY COMMANDER AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL.

THE HEADS OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICES SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF CHIEF OF THEIR RESPECTIVE OFFICE, WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY AN ASSISTANT CHIEF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

The head of the NCR POLICE OFFICE (NCRPO) SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF NCRPO REGIONAL DIRECTOR, with the rank of Police Major General [shall assume the position title of NCR Director.] AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF REGIONAL STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL.

The heads of [the] OTHER POLICE regional offices SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF REGIONAL DIRECTOR, with the rank of Police Brigadier General [shall assume the position title of Regional Director] AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, AND DEPUTY REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS AND CHIEF OF REGIONAL STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

The heads of the [NCR] POLICE districtS [offices] ESTABLISHED IN THE NCR AND IN OTHER METROPOLITAN AREAS SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR, with the rank of Police Brigadier General [shall have the position title of District Director.] AND SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DISTRICT DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DISTRICT DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

The heads of **POLICE** provincial offices **SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF PROVINCIAL DIRECTOR**, with the rank of Police Colonel. [shall be known as Provincial Director.]

THE HEADS OF CITY POLICE OFFICES SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF CITY DIRECTOR, WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

The heads of the POLICE districtS [offices] ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION IN LARGE PROVINCES SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR, with the rank of Police Lieutenant Colonel. [shall have the position title of District Director.]

The heads of the **POLICE STATIONS IN THE** municipal[ity] or city [offices] LEVEL SHALL HAVE THE POSITION TITLE OF CHIEF OF POLICE, with the rank of AT LEAST POLICE CAPTAIN IN THE FORMER AND Police Major IN THE LATTER." [shall be known as Chief of Police."]

Section 7. A new Section 30-A is hereby inserted in Republic Act No. 6975 to read as follows:

"Sec. 30-A. PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE ACADEMY CADETS. - ALL CADETS OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE ACADEMY (PNPA) SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE CHIEF OF THE PNP, OR UPON HIS AUTHORITY, BY THE PNPA DIRECTOR. THEY SHALL HOLD THE POSITION OF POLICE CADET, IN TEMPORARY STATUS, WHICH SHALL RENEWED EVERY YEAR UNTIL THEIR GRADUATION OR SEPARATION FROM THE ACADEMY FOR JUST CAUSE IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS, WHICHEVER COMES FIRST. POLICE CADETS SHALL BE ENTITLED TO ALL SALARIES, BENEFITS AND OTHER EMOLUMENTS GIVEN TO A POLICE **EXECUTIVE MASTER SERGEANT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH** IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS OF REPUBLIC ACT (R.A.) NO. 6975, AS AMENDED BY R.A. NO. 11279, OR THE ACT TRANSFERRING THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE ACADEMY (PNPA) AND THE NATIONAL POLICE TRAINING INSTITUTE (NPTI) FROM THE PHILIPPINE PUBLIC SAFETY COLLEGE (PPSC) TO THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE."

Section 8. Section 31 of Republic Act No. 6975 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 31. Appointment of PNP Officers and Members **TO POSITION AND RANK.** – The appointment of the officers and members of the PNP shall be effected in the following manner:

(a) Patrolman/Patrolwoman to Police Executive Master Sergeant. — Appointed by the PNP regional director for regional personnel, APC COMMANDER FOR APC PERSONNEL, DIRECTOR OF NATIONAL SUPPORT UNITS FOR NATIONAL SUPPORT UNIT PERSONNEL, or by the Chief of the PNP for the national headquarters personnel and attested by the Civil Service Commission;

 (b) Police Lieutenant to Police Lieutenant Colonel. – Appointed by the Chief of the PNP, as recommended by their immediate superiors, **TO**

THE POSITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE APPROVED STAFFING PATTERN AND TO THE CORRESPONDING **RANKS TO BE** and attested by the Civil Service Commission;

(c) Police Colonel to Police Lieutenant General. - Appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Chief of the PNP [, with proper endorsement by the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission] AND THE COMMISSION TO KEY POSITIONS AND TO THE CORRESPONDING RANKS [and subject to confirmation by the Commission on Appointments]; and

(d) Police General. – Appointed by the President TO THE POSITION **OF CHIEF OF THE PNP** from among the senior officers down to the rank of Police Brigadier General in the service."[_rsubject to confirmation by the Commission on Appointments: Provided, That the Chief of the PNP shall serve a tour of duty not to exceed four (4) years: Provided, further, That, in times of war or other national emergency declared by Congress, the President may extend such tour of duty."

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Section 9. Section 35 of Republic Act No. 6975 as amended by Republic Act No. 11279 is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 35. **NATIONAL** Support Units. – The PNP shall be supported by **NATIONAL** administrative and operational support units. [The administrative support units shall consist of the Crime Laboratory, Logistics Unit, Communications Unit, Computer Center, Finance Center, and Civil Security Unit. The operational support units shall be composed of the Maritime Police Unit, Police Intelligence Unit, Police Security Unit, Criminal Investigation Unit, Special Action Force, Narcotics Unit, Aviation Security Unit, Traffic Management Unit, the Medical and Dental Centers and the Civil Relations Unit. To enhance police operational efficiency and effectiveness, the Chief of the PNP may constitute such other **NATIONAL** support units as may be necessary subject to the approval of the Commission: Provided, That no support unit headed by a Police Brigadier General or a higher rank can be created unless provided by law.

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NATIONAL ADMINISTRATIVE AND OPERATIONAL **SUPPORT UNITS SHALL INITIALLY CONSIST OF** THE **FOLLOWING:**

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(a) NATIONAL Administrative Support Units. – [(1) Crime Laboratory. There shall be established a central Crime Laboratory to be headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, which shall provide scientific and technical investigative aid and support to the PNP and other government investigative agencies. It shall also provide crime laboratory examination, evaluation, and identification of physical evidences involved in crimes with primary emphasis on their medical, chemical, biological and physical nature.

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There shall likewise be established regional and city crime laboratories as may be necessary in all regions and cities of the country.] (1) Philippine National Police Academy. – Headed by a

Director with the rank of Police Major General, the Philippine National Police Academy SHALL SERVE AS the premier institution for police education, and the primary source for commissionship of Police Lieutenants. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A Deputy Director AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH with the rank of Police Brigadier General. THE DIRECTOR SHALL SUPERVISE THE ACADEMICS GROUP AND TACTICS GROUP WHICH SHALL BE HEADED BY A Dean of Academics and Commandant OF CADETS, RESPECTIVELY, both with the rank of Police Brigadier General.

[(2) Logistics Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Logistics Unit—shall be responsible for the procurement, distributions and management of all the logistical requirements of the PNP including firearms and ammunition.] (2) National Police Training Institute. — Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Major General, the National Police Training Institute shall be responsible for the mandatory and leadership trainings of all police non-commissioned officers. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(3) Communications Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Communications Unit shall be responsible for establishing an effective police communications network.] (3) Logistics SUPPORT SERVICE. — Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the Logistics SUPPORT SERVICE shall be responsible for the procurement, distributions, and management of all the logistical requirements of the PNP including firearms and ammunition. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(4) Computer Center. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Computer Center shall be responsible for the design, implementation and maintenance of a database system for the PNP.] (4) Communications AND ELECTRONICS SERVICE. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the communications AND ELECTRONICS SERVICE shall be responsible for establishing an effective police communications network. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(5) Finance Center. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Finance Center shall be responsible for providing finance services to the PNP.] (5) INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT SERVICE. — Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT

SERVICE shall be responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of a database system for the PNP. **THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.**

[(6) Civil Security Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Civil Security Unit shall provide administrative services and general supervision over the organization, business operation and activities of all organized private detectives, watchmen, security guard agencies and company guard forces.

The unit shall likewise supervise the licensing and registration of firearms and explosives.

The approval of applications for licenses to operate private security agencies, as well as the issuance of licenses to security guards and the licensing of firearms and explosives, shall be decentralized to the PNP regional offices.] (6) Finance SERVICE. – Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the Finance SERVICE shall be responsible for providing finance services to the PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

- (7) **HEALTH SERVICE**. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the **HEALTH SERVICE** shall be responsible for providing medical and dental services for the PNP. **THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.**
- (8) TRAINING SERVICE. HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE TRAINING SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING TRAINING COURSES GEARED TOWARDS SKILLS ENHANCEMENT, INTELLECTUAL ADVANCEMENT, AND MORAL TRANSFORMATION OF PNP PERSONNEL VITAL TO THE PURSUIT OF A RESPECTABLE AND RESPONSIVE POLICE FORCE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(9) RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS

ADMINISTRATION SERVICE. — HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE PNP RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS ADMINISTRATION SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ADMINISTERING THE RETIREMENT, SEPARATION, AND DEATH BENEFITS OF PNP PERSONNEL AS WELL AS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANS AND PROGRAMS TO UPLIFT THE MORALE AND WELFARE OF THE PNP RETIREES AND THEIR BENEFICIARIES. THE DIRECTOR

SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF
OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(10) HEADQUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE. –
HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE

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HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE HEADOUARTERS SUPPORT SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING HOUSEKEEPING AND CAMP GENERAL **SECURITY** SERVICES TO THE NATIONAL HEADOUARTERS OF THE PHILIPPINE NATIONAL POLICE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BY A DEPUTY ASSISTED **DIRECTOR** ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY **DIRECTOR FOR** OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(11) CHAPLAIN SERVICE. — HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE CHAPLAIN SERVICE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING SPIRITUAL AND OTHER COUNSELING SERVICES FOR THE MORAL GROWTH AND ENHANCEMENT OF PNP PERSONNEL AND DEPENDENTS. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(12) ENGINEERING SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE ENGINEERING SERVICE SHALL BE **FOR** RESPONSIBLE THE OVERALL PLANNING. IMPLEMENTATION, SUPERVISION, AND EVALUATION OF ALL PNP **ENGINEERING** PROGRAMS, SUCH AS CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR PROJECTS, LAND UTILIZATION PROJECTS, HOUSING AND **QUARTERING** PROJECTS, AND OTHER RELATED **ACTIVITIES.** DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY **DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK** OF POLICE COLONEL.

(13) LEGAL SERVICE. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE LEGAL SERVICE SHALL SERVE AS THE LEGAL ARM OF THE ASSIST IN CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION AND PROSECUTION, ACT AS LEGAL COUNSEL OF THE CHIEF OF THE PNP, REPRESENT SUBORDINATE POLICE OFFICES AND HEADS THEREOF IN CIVIL, CRIMINAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS THAT AROSE FROM SERVICE-CONNECTED CASES, AND RENDER LEGAL ON POLICE **OPERATIONS OPINION** AND ADMINISTRATION. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(14) RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION SERVICE. – HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION SERVICE SHALL INSTITUTIONALIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PNP RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION PROGRAM TO ENSURE THE ENTRY OF QUALIFIED AND COMPETENT UNIFORMED PERSONNEL IN THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

(b) **NATIONAL** Operational Support Units. – {(1) Maritime Police Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Maritime Police Unit shall perform all police functions over Philippine territorial waters and rivers.] (1) Criminal Investigation **AND DETECTION** GROUP. – Headed by a Director with the rank of **POLICE MAJOR GENERAL**, the Criminal Investigation **AND DETECTION GROUP** shall undertake the monitoring, investigation and prosecution of all crimes involving economic sabotage, and other crimes of such magnitude and extent as to indicate their commission by highly placed or professional criminal syndicates and organizations.

This GROUP shall likewise investigate all major cases involving violations of the Revised Penal Code and operate against organized crime groups, unless the President assigns the case exclusively to the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI).

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, AND A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(2) Police Intelligence Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Police Intelligence Unit shall serve as the intelligence and counterintelligence operating unit of the PNP.] (2) Civil Security GROUP. – Headed by a Director with the rank of POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, the Civil Security GROUP shall provide administrative services and general supervision over organization, business operation and activities of all organized private detectives, watchmen, security guard agencies and company guardhouses. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

The GROUP shall supervise the [licensing and registration of firearms and explosives,] FIREARMS AND EXPLOSIVES OFFICE, WHICH IS HEADED BY A CHIEF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL WHO SHALL BE

 ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY CHIEF AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

THE GROUP SHALL LIKEWISE SUPERVISE THE SUPERVISORY OFFICE FOR SECURITY AND INVESTIGATION AGENCIES, WHICH IS HEADED BY A CHIEF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL WHO SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY CHIEF AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(3) Police Security Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Police Security Unit shall provide security for government officials, visiting dignitaries and private individuals authorized to be given protection.] (3) Special Action Force. — Headed by a Director with the rank of **POLICE MAJOR GENERAL**, the special action force shall function as a mobile strike force or reaction unit to augment regional, provincial, municipal and city police forces in civil disturbance control, counterinsurgency, hostage-taking rescue operations, and other special operations.

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL AND CHIEF OF STAFF WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(4) Criminal Investigation Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Criminal Investigation Unit shall undertake the monitoring, investigation and prosecution of all crimes involving economic sabotage, and other crimes of such magnitude and extent as to indicate their commission by highly placed or professional criminal syndicates and organizations.

This unit shall likewise investigate all major cases involving violations of the Revised Penal Code and operate against organized crime groups, unless the President assigns the case exclusively to the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI).] (4) PNP ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE MAJOR GENERAL, THE ANTI-CYBERCRIME GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PERTINENT LAWS ON CYBERCRIMES AND ANTI-CYBERCRIME CAMPAIGNS OF THE PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

[(5) Special Action Force. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Special Action Force shall function as a mobile strike force or reaction unit to augment regional, provincial, municipal and city police forces for civil disturbance control, counterinsurgency, hostage taking rescue

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operations, and other special operations. (5) Maritime GROUP. - Headed by a Director with the rank of Police MAJOR General, the Maritime GROUP shall perform all police functions over Philippine territorial waters and rivers. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE **ASSISTED** BY Α **DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR** ADMINISTRATION. **DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR** OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

- [(6) Narcotics Unit. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Narcotics Unit shall enforce all laws relative to the protection of the citizenry against dangerous and other prohibited drugs and substances.] (6) Intelligence GROUP. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police MAJOR General, the Intelligence GROUP shall serve as the intelligence and counterintelligence operating unit of the PNP. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- (7) Aviation Security [Unit] GROUP. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police [Brigadier] MAJOR General, the Aviation Security [Unit] GROUP, in coordination with airport authorities, shall secure all the country's airports against offensive and terroristic acts that threaten civil aviation, exercise operational control and supervision over all agencies involved in airport security operation, and enforce all laws and regulations relative to air travel protection and safety. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED **DEPUTY** BY DIRECTOR **DEPUTY** ADMINISTRATION, **DIRECTOR** OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- (8) [Traffic Management Unit] HIGHWAY PATROL GROUP. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police [Brigadier] MAJOR General, the [Traffic Management Unit] HIGHWAY PATROL GROUP shall enforce traffic laws and regulations. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- [(9) Medical and Dental Centers. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Medical and Dental Centers shall be responsible for providing medical and dental services for the PNP.] (9) PNP FORENSIC GROUP. There shall be established a FORENSIC GROUP to be headed by a Director with the rank of Police General, which shall provide scientific and technical investigative aid and support to the PNP and other government investigative agencies.

It shall also provide forensic examination, evaluation, and identification of physical evidence involved in crimes with primary emphasis on their medical, chemical, biological and physical nature.

There shall likewise be established regional, district, provincial, and city forensic units as may be necessary in all regions and cities of the country.

THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.

- (10) Civil Relations Units. Headed by a Director with the rank of chief superintendent, the Civil Relations Unit shall implement plans and programs that will promote community and citizens' participation in the maintenance of peace and order and public safety. 1 (10) DRUG ENFORCEMENT GROUP. – Headed by a Director with the rank of Police [Brigadier] MAJOR General, the DRUG ENFORCEMENT GROUP shall enforce all laws relative to the protection of the citizenry against dangerous and other prohibited drugs and substances. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BY DEPUTY **DIRECTOR ASSISTED** Α **DEPUTY** ADMINISTRATION, DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- (11) Police Security **AND PROTECTION GROUP**. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the Police Security **AND PROTECTION GROUP** shall provide security for government officials, visiting dignitaries and private individuals authorized to be given protection. **THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR AND CHIEF OF STAFF, BOTH WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.**
- (12) POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT GROUP. Headed by a Director with the rank of Police Brigadier General, the POLICE COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DEVELOPMENT GROUP shall implement plans and programs that will promote community and citizens' participation in the maintenance of peace and order and public safety. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL.
- (13) ANTI-KIDNAPPING GROUP. HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE ANTI-KIDNAPPING GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE IN ADDRESSING KIDNAPPING MENACE IN THE COUNTRY AND IN HANDLING HOSTAGE SITUATIONS. THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY

DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL 1 2 WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 3 (14) EXPLOSIVES AND ORDNANCE AND CANINE 4 GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE RANK OF 5 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE EXPLOSIVES AND ORDNANCE/K9 GROUP SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE 6 7 MANAGEMENT, DEPLOYMENT, UTILIZATION, DEVELOPMENT OF EOD AND CANINE UNITS OF THE PNP. 8 9 THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 10 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF, ALL WITH THE 11 RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 12 **MONITORING** (15)INTEGRITY AND 13 **ENFORCEMENT GROUP. - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH** 14 THE RANK OF POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE 15 16 INTEGRITY MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT GROUP 17 SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR INFORMATION GATHERING OF OFFENSIVE OPERATIONS AGAINST AND CONDUCT 18 **ERRING PNP PERSONNEL.** 19 THE GROUP SHALL CONDUCT INTELLIGENCE BUILD-20 UP AND LAW ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS AGAINST PNP 21 PERSONNEL REPORTED TO 22 BE INVOLVED 23 PROTECTING ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES SUCH AS, BUT NOT TRAFFICKING, 24 LIMITED TO, DRUG HUMAN FINANCIAL CRIMES, CYBERCRIME, 25 TRAFFICKING, MALVERSATION, PILFERAGE, GRAFT AND CORRUPT 26 PRACTICES, AND SECURITY VIOLATIONS. 27 THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 28 29 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR 30 FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF ALL, WITH THE RANK OF POLICE COLONEL. 31 (16) WOMEN AND CHILDREN PROTECTION GROUP. 32 - HEADED BY A DIRECTOR WITH THE 33 POLICE BRIGADIER GENERAL, THE GROUP SHALL BE 34 35 **RESPONSIBLE FOR** THE **IMPLEMENTATION** 36 PERTINENT LAWS ON VIOLATIONS AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN, AND TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS. 37 THE DIRECTOR SHALL BE ASSISTED BY A DEPUTY 38 DIRECTOR FOR ADMINISTRATION, DEPUTY DIRECTOR 39 FOR OPERATIONS, AND CHIEF OF STAFF ALL WITH THE 40

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Section 10. Section 36 of Republic Act No. 6975 as amended by Section 36 of Republic Act No. 8551 is further amended to read as follows:

RANK OF POLICE COLONEL."

"SEC. 36. Status of Members of the Philippine National Police. – The uniformed members of the PNP **INCLUDING POLICE CADETS** shall be considered employees of the National Government and shall draw their salaries therefrom. [They shall have the same salary grade level as that of public school

teachers: THEY SHALL HAVE SALARY GRADE LEVELS PROVIDED UNDER EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 107 SERIES OF 1999: PROVIDED, THAT POLICE CADETS SHALL HAVE SALARY GRADE LEVEL AT LEAST EQUIVALENT TO THAT OF POLICE EXECUTIVE MASTER SERGEANT. Provided, That PNP members assigned in Metropolitan Manila, chartered cities and first class municipalities may be paid financial incentive by the local government unit concerned subject to the availability of funds."

Section 11. Section 32 of Republic Act No. 8551 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 32. Promotion by Virtue of Position. - Any PNP personnel **APPOINTED OR** designated to any key position whose rank is lower than that which is required for such position shall, fafter six (6) months of occupying the same] UPON RECOMMENDATION BY THE COMMISSION, be entitled to a rank adjustment corresponding to the position: [Provided, That the personnel shall not be reassigned to a position calling for a higher rank until after two (2) years from the date of such rank adjustment]: Provided, [further,] That any personnel **APPOINTED OR** designated to the position who does not possess the established minimum qualifications therefor shall occupy the same temporarily for not more than six (6) months without reappointment or extension."

Section 12. Appropriations. - The amount necessary to cover the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Philippine National Police. Thereafter, the amount necessary for its continued implementation shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act of the PNP.

Sec. 13. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – The Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) and the PNP shall, within ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the rules and regulations to effectively implement the provisions of this Act.

Section 14. Separability Clause. If any part or provision of this Act is held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

Section 15. Repealing Clause. - All other provisions of Republic Act No. 6975, as amended by Republic Act No. 8551, otherwise known as the 'Philippine National Police Reform and Reorganization Act of 1998', that have reference to the foregoing police offices and support units, the heads thereof and their corresponding ranks, and all other laws, executive orders, rules and regulations, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act shall be deemed modified or repealed accordingly.

Section 16. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
