BARRIO BANTAYAN IN LINGAYEN, PANGASINAN

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to convert the sitio of Bantayan in the Municipality of Lingayen, Province of Pangasinan, into a barrio of said municipality, to be known as the barrio of Bantayan.

The proposed barrio has a sufficient number of inhabitants, embraces a large geographic area and is very progressive. The enactment of this bill is a forward step to bring the blessings of good government to the residents therein and is in accordance with the rural development program of the Administration. This bill, if approved, will bring about the consummate fulfillment of a long-felt demand of the inhabitants to give them a chance to manage their barrio affairs and help in the development and uplift of the Municipality of Lingayen.

An Act to convert the Municipal District of San Luis, Sub-province of Aurora, Province of Quezon, into a municipality.

(The following is the whole text of the bill.)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

It has long been the clamor of the residents of the Municipal District of San Luis, Sub-province of Aurora, to have a more autonomous form of government.

The municipal district, created on June 21, 1959 by virtue of Republic Act No. 2452, had during the ensuing fiscal year realized a total receipt of P12,005, or P8,000 more than the requirement, under Section 2 of Republic Act No. 1515, for the conversion of a municipal district into a regular municipality. Moreover, the rapid economic advancement and progress of this place can be compared considerably with that of other regular fifth-class municipalities. Roads, bridges and school buildings, and other public works projects, have been constructed, thereby providing the inhabitants with vital arteries for transporting their farm produce to the neighboring towns, and giving the children the opportunity to pursue their studies on the elementary level.

In view of the foregoing, the author strongly recommends the conversion of the Municipal District of San Luis into a regular municipality.

AN ACT TO CONVERT THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SAN LUIS, SUB-PROVINCE OF AURORA, PROV-INCE OF QUEZON, INTO A MUNICIPALITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The Municipal District of San Luis, Sub-province of Aurora, Province of Quezon, is hereby converted into a municipality.

SEC. 2. The present mayor, vice-mayor and councilors of the Municipal District of San Luis shall be the mayor, vice-mayor and councilors, respectively, of the new municipality until their successors shall have been elected in the next regular elections for provincial and municipal officials and shall have qualified.

SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

MUNICIPALITY OF DINGALAN IN SUB-PROVINCE OF AURORA, QUEZON

An Act to convert the Municipal District of Dingalan, Sub-province of Aurora, Province of Quezon, into a municipality.

(The following is the whole text of the bill.)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The attached measure is the answer to the persistent demand of the people of the Municipal District of Dingalan, Sub-province of Aurora, Province of Quezon, to have a more autonomous form of government by converting the settlement into a regular municipality.

Dingalan, created on June 16, 1956 by virtue of Republic Act No. 1536, has complied with the fiscal requirement set forth in Section 2 of Republic Act No. 1515 which provides, among other things, that "any first class municipal district the annual receipts of which shall average more than four thousand pesos for four consecutive fiscal years shall ipso facto be classified as a fifth class municipality." Records show that the said municipal district has for the past five consecutive fiscal years realized an aggregate income of P26,-739.76 — or an annual average receipt of P5,347.85 — broken down as follows:

In view of the foregoing, enactment of the accompanying bill is strongly recommended.
