

1156—An Act creating a Patent Office, prescribing its powers and duties, regulating the issuance of patents, and appropriating funds therefor.

*Introduced by Congressmen Roy, Lim, Baculio and Lomuntad, April 29, 1947;*

*Referred to the Committee on Patents, on the same day;*

*Reported (C. Rp' No. 397), recommending approval without amendment in consolidation with H. Nos. 525, 573, 863 and 915 appearing as co-authors Congressmen Suarez, Clarin, Ricohermoso, Laurel, Sumulong and Fernandez, May 5, 1947;*

*Passed on second reading, May 12, 1947;*

*Passed on third reading, May 19, 1947;*

*Sent to the Senate requesting concurrence, on the same day;*

*Passed by the Senate without amendment, May 20, 1947;*

*Approved by the President, June 20, 1947;*
