Senstor TIRONA. Mr. President, it is a well fact that not in every municipality there sa public library where our people may read meds so necessary for the enlargement of their priedge not only in science and the arts but in regard to civic duties. Not all our peoread newspapers so that they may know what the main events not only regarding our local but also regarding international prob-Now this bill intends to supplement that sticency because of the sincere belief that in oris that democracy should be operative or real morsey in action there is a need of public nuien and the public opinion should come from edizens well informed about the principal sents in our country and the main achievements our government especially at this time when ter is a conflict of ideologies, the spreading of ternation is very essential if we want to preare the blessings of democracy.

Mr. President, the purpose of this bill is to satish five to eight experimental book mobile two or three in Luzon, two or three in the Tagas and one or two in Mindanao. Each book mobile is scheduled to visit towns and villages not enjoying the services of a public library. The townspeople will be able to borrow books from the shelves of book mobiles or return books previously borrowed. They may also read newspapers or magazines that are available, and the towns or barrios may be served each day or visited once or twice a week or oftener. In this way the rural areas will be able to benefit from the public library service, and these library facilities may be supplemented with pictures, newsreels and radio equipment, and so equipped with each set, such book mobile units can be a powerful means of educating the public.

Now your committee is preesnting an amendment in Section 2, line 4; between the words "hereby" and "appropriated" insert the words "authorized to be".

With this amendment we respectfully submit the bill to the kind consideration of the Senate, and therefore I move that the amendment introduced by the committee right now be approved by the Senate.

CORPORATION TO BE KNOWN IN ENG-LISH AS "KNIGHTS OF RIZAL" AND IN SPANISH AS "ORDEN DE CABALLEROS DE RIZAL", AND TO DEFINE ITS PUR-POSES AND POWERS.

WHEREAS, a civic organization known as "Orden de Caballeros de Rizal" (Knights of Rimal) was incorporated under the Corporation Law of the Philippines in the year 1916 by patriotic citizens for the following purposes:

- "(a) To develop the most perfect union among the Filipinos in revering the memory of Dr. Jose Rizal:
- "(b) To promote among the associated knights the spirit of patriotism and Rizalian chivalry;
- "(c) To study and spread the teachings of Dr. Jose Rizal and keep ever alive his consecrated memory and to make effective his exemplary and exalted principlés: and
- "(d) To organize the annual festivities in honor of Dr. Rizal."

WHEREAS, there is greater need than ever for the Filipino people to propagate and to practice the teachings of Rizal;

WHEREAS, the Knights of Rizal, if officially recognized and vested with appropriate powers, would be a convenient instrumentality by which the teachings of our national hero may be propagated among our people of the end that they emulate and follow his examples; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to grant legislative Charter to the said Knights of Rizal in order to accord official recognition to it and to enlarge its powers so that it may more fully and more effectively accomplish the laudable purposes for which it was organized: Now, therefore
