ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE OFFICIAL VISIT OF 61 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPALS FROM 13 REGIONS OF THE COUNTRY

Senator Tatad. They belong to Batch No. 4 of TAO, which means, Teachers Advancement for Optimum Well-being or Teresa Aquino-Oreta [Laughter]...
