Given the present slate of the dental profession and the problems that plague our country's oral health, your Committee has decided to present this proposed measure as a feasible solution to the inadequacy of the current laws on the subject.

Senate Bill No. 2581, as embodied in Committee Report No. 232, therefore seeks to:

- 1. Enumerate and clearly define the scope and practice of dentistry, dental hygienists and dental technologists;
- 2. Mandate the integration of all registered dentists, dental hygienists and dental technologist into one accredited professional organization which shall be recognized by the board and accredited by the commission;
- 3. Promote the continuing professional education (CPE) for dentists, dental hygienists and dental technologists in order to upgrade their knowledge and enhance the profession;
- 4. Mandate the registration of foreign dentists under the principle of foreign reciprocity; and
- 5. Provide for a higher penalty that includes the imposition of fine and imprisonment for illegal practice of dentistry, dental hygienists and dental technologists.

By enacting the amendments embodied in this committee report, it is my ferventhope that this will pave the way for a more proficient practice by our dentists, dental hygienists and dental technologists thereby guaranteeing and improving the oral health profile of the Filipino people.

It is for these reasons that approval of this proposed measure is earnestly requested.
